Commenced with strong winds at 8, accompanied with thick fog squalls steering S.W. at 4 P.M. spoke Ship Ontario Brown Baybush. Nothing this season. Middle and latter part strong winds at 8 W with thick fog and rain. Ship under short sail saw nothing. Employed Boiling.

Sunday June 13th

Commenced with light winds at 8 W with thick fog. Employed Boiling. Nothing in sight. Middle part light with fog further Boiling. Latter part strong winds at 8 W and overcast stars. N.E. saw nothing but Finnbucks.
Lat by Ch 54,35. N Long by account 174,00 W

Monday June 14th

Commenced with fresh gales at 8 S with thick weather. steering S.E. Nothing in sight. Middle and latter part fresh gales at 8 W. Ship heading N.W. & W. under short sail saw nothing but one rail. Lat by Ch 54,12. N Long by Chro 174,00 W.

Tuesday June 15th

Commenced with fresh gales at 8 W. Ship heading N.W. Employed Coopering Oil. Middle and latter part light winds at 8 W heading N.W. at 4 P.M. saw St. Matthew Island Dist 30 Mls. bearing N.E. one Ship in sight. Employed steering down Oil. Lat by Ch 60,10. N Long by Chro 174,14 W

Wednesday June 16th

Commenced with light winds at 8 W heading N.W. Nothing in sight but the Land. Middle and latter part strong winds at 8 with thick fog and rain. Ship heading N.W. to W under short sail saw nothing. No Obs.
Lat by account 60,35. N Long by account 176,00

Thursday June 17th

Commenced with fresh gales at 8 steering W under short, with thick fog and rain saw one Ship. Middle and latter part light winds at 8 W with thick fog. Ship close to the ice saw 2 Ships one Boiling. No Obs Lat by account 61,00. N Long 176,45 W.

Friday June 18th

Commenced with light winds at 8 W with thick fog. Ship laying a back close to the ice. Middle and latter part the rain & Ships in sight at noon spoke Ship Phoenix Rousten New London.
No Obs Lat by account 61,25. N Long by Chro 177,20 W

Saturday June 19th

Commenced with light winds at 8 S with thick fog squalls. Ship on opposite tacks close to the ice at 7 P.M. spoke Ship Nile. He & San Francisco one Whale. Middle and latter part fresh breezes at N with thick fog, except lightning up for a few minutes at a time. At 2 P.M. saw one bp Whale yawning quick to the surface. No Obs.

Lat by account 61,20. N Long by Chro 177,35 W

Sunday June 20th

Commenced with fresh breezes at N. accompanied with thick fog. Ship close to the ice under short sail saw 3 Ships. At 4 past 6 P.M. the fog lifted up saw some 6 or 8 Whales yawning quick to the surface. Lower the Boat to no purpose the fog shut in thick. Middle and latter part light winds at N with thick fog most of the time and some rain. Ship standing on opposite tacks close to the ice, saw nothing. No Obs.
