Middle and latter part strong gales from N.E.
with a heavy sea, at 11 A.M. came down the marks
and hauled the fore sail, saw Nothing
No Obs Lat by account 61, 38. N Long by ~~the~~ 179, 20. W

Tuesday June 29th
Commences with strong gales at N.E. Ship
under short sail. Nothing in sight, Middle
and latter part strong gale at N.E. with thick
fog and rain Ship standing on off shore tacks
saw several Whales to rugged to Whale.
No Obs Lat by account 61, 45. N Long by account 179, 15. W

Wednesday June 30th
Commences with strong gales at N.E.
accompanied with rain. Ship under short
sail. Nothing in sight, Middle part much
the same. Latter part light winds and baffling
with fog squalls, started the Marks and
finished Reeling. Employed Coasting and stowing
oil, saw Nothing but Ships No Obs
Lat by account 61, 38. N Long by ~~the~~ 179, 05. W

Thursday July 1st
Commences with light airs at N. Nothing in
sight, Employed Coasting and stowing oil
Middle part calm latter part light winds at N.E. W
Ship heading N.W. saw Nothing but Ships, Employed
stowing oil, Lat by a glimpse of the sun 61, 44. N
Long by account 179, 00. W



Thursday July 2nd
Commences with light winds at N. Ship heading
N.W. Nothing in sight but Ships Middle part
light winds with thick fog most of the time at 6
P.M. saw several Whales lower part and the
Whale took the line the fog shut in thick
saw Nothing more of the Whale. at 9 P.M. the
fog lifted saw 2 Whales lower but the fog
shut in thick. Latter part thick fog saw Nothing
No Obs Lat by account 61, 50. N Long by ~~the~~ 179, 10. W

Friday July 3rd
Commences with light winds from Eastward
with thick fog most of the time saw
Nothing but Ships, Middle part the same latter
part fresh breezes at 8 A.M. steering N.E. at 8 saw
the ice stood a long the ice. At 9 A.M. saw a Ship
on fire it proved to be the Warren of Warren
at 10 saw Whales lower and Chase several
Whales with out success. run 25 Ships in sight
Lat by Obs 62, 33. N Long by account 179, 15. W

Sunday July 5th
Commences with light winds at N.E. several
Whales in sight at 3 P.M. parted the Iron drew
the Whale went up spouting belud at 5 parted
one Iron drew and the short snarp parted, Chase
Whales till 9 P.M. with out success, Middle part
thick weather, latter part fine weather Boats
of Chasing Whales to no purpose
No Obs Lat by account 62, 32. N Long by account 179, 20. W
