


 Tuesday July 13th
 Commences with fresh breezes at 8 steering
 N. E. at 6 P.M. saw several Whales lowered to no
 purpose. Middle and Latter part fresh gales at
 N. E. with thick fog. Ship under short sail
 on opposite tacks. close to the land.
 Lat 65.10. Long 169.25. W

Wednesday July 14th
 Commences with fresh gales at N. E. with
 thick fog. Ship on opposite tacks. at 7
 P.M. Calm with thick fog. Dropped Anchor
 Middle and Latter part light winds at N. E. with
 thick fog and rain. Ship at anchor 15 Mls from
 the land. at Midnight saw one Whale
 Lat by 64.45. N. Long 169.50. W

Thursday July 15th
 Commences with strong winds at N. with
 thick fog and a rain storm. Middle part
 clear up. at 5 A.M. took the anchor and made
 sail. Light winds from N. E. at 8 A.M. saw
 one Whale lowered to no purpose. at 11 saw
 several Whales lowered and chased with
 out success 6 Ships in sight
 Lat 65.15. N. Long 169.45. W

Friday July 16th
 Commences with strong winds at N. E.
 and raged plenty of Whales in sight Boats
 of chasing to no purpose. Middle part thick
 fog and rain. Ship under short sail. Latter
 part much the same. saw one Ship
 Lat 65.30. N. Long 169.20.


 Saturday July 17th
 Commences with light winds with thick weather
 Ship close to the Diamond Islands, at 4 P.M. thick
 fog. took in sail and Dropped Anchor. Middle part
 calm and thick fog. Latter part baffling winds and clear
 at 5 A.M. took the anchor, saw no live Whales
 but picked up a dead Whale, took the Whale a long
 side at 11 A.M. and dropped anchor close to East
 Cape

Sunday July 18th
 Commences with light winds at 8 employed
 cutting the Whale. at 9 P.M. finished the winds
 shifting to N. W. and blowing a strong gale
 took the anchor and lay to. Middle part strong
 gales at N. W. with a thick rain storm
 Latter part light baffling air and pleasant. Ship
 close to the land 4 Ships in sight. Employed
 Bailing. Lat 65.40. N. Long 170.00.

Monday July 19th
 Commences with light winds at 8 and pleasant
 at 6 P.M. saw a large number of Whales, lowered
 and chased to no purpose. Middle and Latter part
 baffling winds. Ship close to the land. no
 Whales in sight. Employed Bailing
 Lat 65.55. N. Long 169.34. W.

Tuesday July 20th
 Commences with strong winds at 8 P.M.
 saw one Whale lowered to no purpose. finished
 Bailing. Middle and Latter part light air with
 thick rainy weather. Employed stowing
 down oil, saw several Whales. lowered
 one Boat fastened and the Iron Break
 at 11 A.M. finished stowing oil, 9 Ships
 in sight. Lat 65.48. N. Long 169.30. W.
