

Tuesday July 27th

Commences with strong winds at 8 with fog
Ship at anchor see Nothing of the Absent
Boat. finished stowing oil, Middle and Latter
part fresh breezes at 8 with fog squalls saw
9 Ships, at 8 A.M. took the anchor stowed 1
at 10 spoke Ship Ocean Swift 20 Whales this
season, Ship Marcus Sherman 11 Whales.
Ship close in to Diomed Islands

Wednesday July 28th

Commences with strong winds at 8 with
thick fog Ship under short sail heading 88° E
Middle and Latter part fresh winds at 8 with
fog and rain Ship standing on off-shear tacks
saw Whales growing quick to the Lathan
didn't lower, Ship between East Cape and
the Diomed Islands

Thursday July 29th

Commences with light winds from 88° E
with thick fog squalls and showers of rain
saw Whales lower to no purpose, Middle
and Latter part light winds at 8 with thick
fog most of the time, plenty of Whales in
sight when the fog lites up. Lower to no
purpose. Lat 66° 30' N. Long 170° 10'

Friday July 30th

Commences with light winds at 8 with fog
squalls plenty of Whales in sight Lower
and Chased, with out success. Middle and Latter
part fresh winds at 8 with thick fog Ship under
short sail standing on off-shear tacks saw
several Whales close to the Ship in the fog didn't
lower. No obs Lat 66° 30' N. Long 170° 20'

Saturday July 31st

Commences with light winds at 8 accompanied
with thick fog squalls. 15 Ships in sight saw
no Whales, Middle and Latter part light airs and Calms with
thick fog saw Nothing, Emplage raising up Shakes
Lat 66° 37' N. Long 168° 50'

Sunday August 1st

Commences with a Calm and thick fog Nothing
in sight, Middle part the same Latter part light airs
and Calms with fog squalls saw one BH Whale seemed
to no purpose 15 Ships in sight
Lat 66° 37' N. Long 170° 55' W

Monday August 2nd

Commences with light airs at 88° E with fog squalls
Ship standing S.W. the Land in sight saw large numbers
of small Whales, Middle and Latter part light baffling
winds with thick fog most of the time Ship working
to the S.E. saw Nothing but the Land and one Ship
No obs Lat 66° 30' N. Long 170° 25' W

Tuesday August 3rd

Commences with light baffling winds from Westward
with thin fog steering 8 by 8 plenty of small in sight
also the Land and 2 Ships. At 8 light Cornuall came on
Board from the former reports 8 Whales, Middle and Latter
part Calm with thick fog saw Nothing No obs
Lat 66° 30' N. Long 170° 25' W

Wednesday August 4th

Commences with light winds at 8 with thick fog
steering 8 by 8 Nothing in sight, Middle part Calm
and thick fog Latter part light winds at 88° E with thick
fog Ship heading 8 saw Nothing. No obs
Lat 66° 25' N. Long 170° 10' W
