Commences with light winds at 8 with thick fog
Ship heading 88° E. At 5 PM took in sail and Drove
Anchor. Nothing in sight, Middle part calm with
thick fog. Latter part variable winds from S to E. At 9
AM the fog lifted up East Cape and the Diamond Island
15. Mib Dist. at 9 PM took the anchor and made all sail
stand 8° E. while taking the anchor on the Star
the lashing to the hoisting Bunt and parts
and Crissle 3 men, at 11 PM saw Whale, got dinner
and Lamer. No obs

Friday August 6th

Commences with fresh breezes at 8 PM Boat down
after Whaler. at 5 PM Jorden and Kib, at 10 PM took the
Whale long side the Ship, at 9 PM commenced cutting
At 11 PM spoke Bark Fortune Jans. & Whaler.
Capt Jans informed me that he saw my Boat
Crew and Anna Ship Lamer & Sack Harbor
At 1 PM finished cutting, Latter part light winds
at N N E with fine pleasant weather Ship
heading 3 under moderate sail, saw nothing
but Ship and the Land, Employed clearing up
and getting ready to Boil, No obs

Ship 20 Mib N E of East Cape

Saturday August 7th

Commences with light winds at N N E, Ship
heading 3 under moderate sail, saw no
Whaler Employed variously. At 2 PM commenced
Boiling, Middle part calm with thick fog
Latter part fresh breezes at 88° E with fog squalls
Ship standing on opposite tack saw nothing
but 2 Ships and the Land, Employed Boiling, No obs

Ship 15 Mib N N E of East Cape

Sunday August 8th

Commences with fresh breezes from 88° E with thick fog
Ship under short sail, Middle part the same.
Latter part light winds at 8 with thick fog squalls
Ship standing on opposite tack saw one Whale
going quick to the Southward, also the Land, Employed
Boiling breaking out starting fresh Water and
Cansering, No obs

Lat by account 66,40. N Long 170,15. W

Monday August 9th

Commences with light winds at 8 with thick fog
squalls, Ship close to the Land, saw 2 Whales
going quick didn't Lamer Employed Boiling
and stowing down oil, Middle and Latter part
light backing air with thick fog most of the time
at 4 PM Capt Baker came on Board from Ship Columbus
of Mystic 1600 lbs, saw nothing of any account
Employed Boiling and stowing down oil, No obs

Tuesday August 10th

Commences with light winds at N steering
88° E, with fine pleasant weather, one Ship in
sight the Land and a plenty of small Whales
Employed variously at 7 PM finished Boiling, Middle
part calm with thick fog, Latter part light winds
at N and pleasant steved 88° E close to the Land
one Ship in sight, Employed variously finished
stowing oil, No obs
