

Tuesday May 31st

Commences with strong gale at N.E. with thick and rainy weather several Ships in sight and plenty of ice Middle and latter part fresh winds at N.E. Ship working in the ice, 40 Ships in sight likewise the land off Cape Shadows

Lat by account 61.54. N Long 181.20. W

Wednesday June 1st

Commences with strong winds at N.E. Ship in the ice plenty of Ships in sight and the land Middle and latter light hupling winds with thick fog squalls nothing in sight but ice and Ship. N

Lat by account 61.50. N Long 181.30. W

Thursday June 2nd

Commences with light airs at N. Ship in the ice several Ships in sight Middle and latter part Calm. Ship, land and plenty of ice in sight,

Lat by Obs 62.00. N Long 181.50. W

Friday June 3rd

Commences with a Calm, repaired the Main & Gallant Sail, middle and latter part light airs and Calm 26 Ships in sight, also the Cape Shadows and plenty of ice saw one Whale yawning quick Lardner and Lardner to no purpose. Lat by Obs 62.07. N Long 181.20. W

Saturday June 4th

Commences with light airs at N.E. Ship, land and plenty of ice in sight Middle and latter part the same. This day engaged tipping the Ship repairing the Cutwater Sheathing and Gasper it being large a way by the ice. No Obs

Lat by account 62.05. Long 181.15. W

Sunday June 5th

Commences with Calm Ship, land and ice in sight saw one Ship Bailing, Middle and latter part light hupling was accompanied with rain and thick fog squalls the same in sight as usual. Lat 62.03. N Long 181.15. W

Monday June 6th

Commences with light airs and Calm with fog squalls several Ships in sight and plenty of ice, middle and latter part much the same.

Lat 62.04. N Long 181.10. W

Tuesday June 7th

Commences with strong winds at W.S.W. Ship on opposite tacks in the ice several Ships in sight Middle and latter part fresh winds at W. with thick fog squalls. Lat by account 62.06. N Long 181.10. W

Wednesday June 8th

Commences with light winds with thick fog middle and latter part much the same saw several Ships. Lat by account 62.02. N Long 181.12. W

Thursday June 9th

Commences with light airs at S.W. with thick fog nothing in sight but ice middle the same. Latter part light hupling airs and there 52 Ships in sight and a plenty of ice, but no Whales.

Lat by Obs 62.14. N Long 181.02. W

Friday June 10th

Commences with light airs at E. Ship working through the ice towards Cape Shadows, 50 and Ships in sight Middle and latter part fresh winds at N. Ship standing on opposite tacks saw one Whale Lardner to no purpose, the land and plenty of Ships in sight
