

Saturday June 11th.

Commences with light winds at N. saw several Whales, giving quick. Landed to no purpose middle and latter part light winds at N. Ship close to the Land 56 Ships in sight and plenty of ice, no Whales
Lat 62.20. N. Long 180.00.

Sunday June 12th.

Commences with strong winds at N. E. Ships steering in all directions. no Whales in sight middle and latter part light winds at E. Ship close to Cape Hudson, plenty of Ships and ice in sight. Lat 62.30. N. Long 179.40. W.

Monday June 13th.

Commences with light winds at N. E. no Whales in sight middle and latter part the same Land ice and Ships in sight Lat 62.25. Long 179.50. W.

Tuesday June 14th.

Commences with light winds at N. steering E. saw one Whale giving quick toward to no purpose middle and latter much the same saw one Whale toward to no purpose Ship close to the Land
Lat 62.25. N. Long 180.00. W.

Wednesday June 15th.

Commences with a fresh breeze at S. W. steering different courses. saw Nothing but Ships Land and ice, middle and latter part light winds and variable the same in sight as usual, Ship close to the Land, Lat 62.30. Long 179.30. W.

Thursday June 16th.

Commences with light winds at S. N. E. Nothing in sight but Ships Land and ice, middle and latter part light winds at S. N. E. Ship close to the Land at Midnight a Canoe of Indians came on Board, latter part light winds at W. steering E. saw Nothing but Ships.

Lat 62.22. N. Long 178.40. W.

Friday June 17th.

Commences with light winds at S. W. steering E. N. E. several Ships in sight, at 6 P. M. spoke Ship John one Whale. middle part strong winds at S. by latter part steered N. E. saw several Ships.
Lat 62.30. N. Long 178.00. W.

Saturday June 18th.

Commences with fresh gales at S. steering N. Nothing in sight middle and latter part fresh gales at S. with thick fog and rain most of the time Ship steering to the North among the ice. saw Nothing. Lat 62.50. N. Long 175.30. W.

Sunday June 19th.

Commences with strong winds at S. Nothing in sight but ice, middle and latter part strong winds at S. W. Ship steering through the ice to the North saw the Land of Cape Chaplin, and a plenty of ice, fresh to the S. E.
Lat 62.56. N. Long 174.40. W.

Monday June 20th.

All the day sails fresh winds at S. W. Ship heading S. E. spoke Ship Lament Cooper 1 Whale, saw plenty of ice and Whales.

Lat 62.01. N. Long 171.38. W.
