

Friday July 1<sup>st</sup>  
Commences with strong winds at E. with thick  
fog squalls ship close to the ice no Whales in  
sight. at 7 AM spoke Ship Brackley & Whaler middle  
and latter part light air and Calms, Land Ships  
and ice in sight no Whales.

Lat by obs 63.23. N. Long. 179.00. W

Saturday July 2<sup>nd</sup>  
Commences with light airs at E. the same in  
sight as usual, spoke Ship Doyle and Indigo  
Nothing middle part light winds at E. latter part  
strong winds at E. Ship working to the Eastward  
threw ice in a thick fog. saw 2 Ships.

No obs Lat by account 63.10. N. Long. 178.20. W

Sunday July 3<sup>rd</sup>  
Commences with strong winds at E. Ship  
leading E & S. thick fog Nothing in sight, middle  
and latter part strong winds at E. with thick fog  
squalls, Ship heading W & S. saw 1 Ship.

No obs Lat by account 62.50. N. Long. 178.00. W

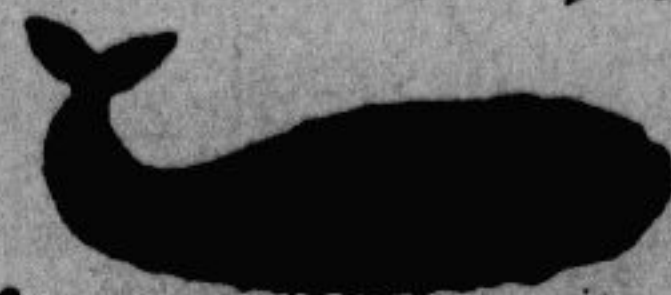
Monday July 4<sup>th</sup>  
Commences with strong winds at E. with  
fog squalls, saw 2 Whales lowered to no purpose  
middle and latter part strong winds at E. with  
thick fog most of the time, Ship standing on  
Opposite tacks, saw several Ships.

No obs. Lat by account 62.45. N. Long. 178.10.

Tuesday July 5<sup>th</sup>  
Commences with strong winds at E. accompanied  
with thick fog. saw one Ship, Middle and latter  
part light winds with thick fog most of the time  
saw one Whale and plenty of ice lowered to no purpose

Lat by obs 62.58. N. Long. 178.00. W

Wednesday July 6<sup>th</sup>  
Commences with a calm and thick fog squalls  
spoke Ship Louis Howland. Nothing middle and  
latter part slight winds at Eastward steered from  
SW to W saw several Ships and plenty of ice and fog  
Lat by obs 63.00. N. Long. 178.40. W



Thursday July 7<sup>th</sup>  
Commences with strong winds at E. with thick  
fog squalls. steering West, saw plenty of ice to  
the North and Westward at 10 AM saw several Whales  
lowered and fastened and killed at 5 PM took the Whale  
a long ride, the Boat out of site most of the time  
while part to the Whale in thick fog squalls, took  
the Whale on the Starboard side and towed off from  
the ice till 8 PM. Wore Ship and commenced cutting  
the wind blowing strong from E & S. and in  
creasing to a gale. accompanied with thick fog  
and rain, the Land about 15 Mils distant under our lee  
and the ice much nearer, after 6 hours hard  
work and much more maneuvering we got the  
Ships and then cut in, the fore tower out, and a part  
of the pluck Chain parted and the Whale sunk  
made all pendant sail and wore Ship to keep  
clear of the ice and Land. latter part fresh gale  
at E & S with thick fog and rain, Ship heading  
E & S. all pendant sail set, Nothing in sight

Saw 5 boats and one Spade. and 7 fathoms Chain

Friday July 8<sup>th</sup>  
Commences with strong gale at E & S with thick  
fog and rain Ship heading E & S. all pendant sail  
set, middle part hailing. latter part light winds at  
E. with thick fog, steered N. saw Nothing but large  
Reefing. No obs. Lat by account 63.10. N. Long. 177.08. W
