

Monday July 14th
Commences with a calm & employed blowing up 12 ships
in sight, middle and latter part calm with hailing
airs saw one Whale & went to no purpose, employed
Boiling. No Obs Lat by account 64.10. Long 174.50. W

Tuesday July 15th
Commences with a calm 19 ships in sight and
plenty of ice spoke ship Jemalane 2 Whales
middle part light winds saw several Whales
in the ice & went to no purpose latter part calm
got in contact with heavy ice got out
with out much damage employed Boiling
No Obs Lat by account 64.12. N. Long 174.30

Wednesday July 16th
Commences with light hailing airs with thick
fog squalls spoke ship James Foster 3 Whales
At 5 P.M. dropped anchor to keep clear of the
ice at 6 saw several Whales in the ice & went
forward and the line parted, commenced it
and laid a new line middle and latter part
calm with fog squalls, ship at anchor several
ships and the ice in sight employed Boiling
and stowing down oil, No Obs.
Lat by account 64.12. 174.30. W

Thursday July 17th
Commences with a calm nothing in sight but
ships and ice, middle part the same ship at anchor
employed Boiling and stowing down, latter
part light hailing winds at 8 A.M. took the
anchor steamed N.W. 17 ships in sight and
the ice. No Obs Lat by account 64.20. N. Long 174.40

Friday July 18th
Commences with light winds at 8 with rainey
weather finished Boiling and closed the main
hatch way, At 4 P.M. saw Whales & went forward
and the Whale run in the ice and got the line
a pull up the ice and parted, the ice being very
heavy could not get the line clear by the
means lost the Whale and 550 fathoms of line and
14 tons. Middle part fresh gales with rain, latter
light airs and calm, Boats off in the ice saw
several Whales to no purpose 19 ships in sight.
No Obs Lat by account 64.25. N. Long 174.30. W

Saturday July 19th
Commences with a calm Boats in the ice
got nothing middle part thick fog squalls
latter part strong winds at N.W. with rain
squalls, sent the Boats in the ice saw several
Whales to no purpose.
Lat by Obs 64.34. N. Long 174.20. W

Sunday July 20th
Commences with squally weather Boats in
the ice saw Whales got nothing middle and
latter part strong winds at N.W. ship heading
N.E. nothing in sight but ship
Lat by Obs 64.25. N. Long by Chron 174.35. W

Monday July 21st
Commences with strong winds at N. at 3 P.M. spoke
ship Lydia Fairbairn 3 Whales, middle part strong
W.S.W. latter part calm 20 ships in sight, no Whales
employed scraping down
Lat by Obs 64.19. N. Long by Chron 174.35. W
