Commences with strong winds at N. heading
W. & W. saw nothing by the land, middle part lay by
further part strong winds at N. & W. and ocean east heading
N. & E. saw the land and one ship

S. & E. middle part strong gales at S. & W. lay by
further part strong gales at S. & W. ship heading
W. & W. saw nothing

Saturday January 28th
Commences with strong gales at S. & W. ship
heading W. & W. middle part lay by further part
strong winds at N. & W. heading N. & E. saw
nothing. Lat & Lon 45.06. S Long 176.29. W

Sunday January 29th
Commences with strong winds at N. & W. heading
S. & W. middle part lay by further part light
winds at S. & W. steered W. & W. to N. through the straits
between Chatham and Pel's Island, saw one ship
Lat & Lon 44.11. S

Monday January 30th
Commences with light winds at S. steering N. & E.
close to the land, at 5 P.M. anchored on the S. side
of Chatham Sound the George & Mary of New London
at anchor 8. Mouths out clear, middle part calm
further part light winds at N. & W. yet 10 fathoms
of water

Tuesday January 31st
Commences with light winds at N. & W. ship at
anchor, middle light, further strong winds at N. & W.
emplaced evenly.

Wednesday February 1st
Commences with fresh gales at N. & W. ship at
anchor. Middle part more moderate at
daylight yet 2 pipes of broad from the ship
George & Mary, also received a bar Pine Spar
not being able to obtain recruits at 7 A.M.
~~the ship~~ took the anchor head a strong
breeze at N. & E. steered S. & W. & W.

Thursday February 2nd
Commences with fresh gales at N. & W. ship
heading W. Middle part much the same. Further
part light winds at N. & W. heading N. & E. saw
nothing but the land, emplaced in ship's duty
Lat & Lon 43.56. S Long 177.00. W

Friday February 3rd
Commences with light winds at N. heading
W. & W. middle part the same further part light
winds at N. & E. heading S. & E. saw nothing
emplaced in ship's duty

Saturday February 4th
Commences with light winds at N. & E.
heading S. & E. the N. & W. part of Chatham
Island in sight, middle part the same. Further
part light winds at N. & E. ship working to
the N. & E. between the Sisters and Chatham Island
Lat. Close the Sisters East 2 miles bearing
N. by E. No clouds thick overcast
