

Monday July 11th
Commenced with a calm and thick fog. Employed
Boiling middle and latter parts light haphing
aim with thick fog. finished Boiling saw 2 Whales toward
to no purpose. Lat & account 54.27. N Long 134.10.

Tuesday July 12th
Commenced with light winds at 8 with thick
fog. Ship a mummy the ice under short sail
Employed stowing Oil. Middle and latter parts
strong winds at N.E. with thick fog and
rain. Ship on apparent tacks under short
sail. saw several Ship. spoke Ship Decker
3 Whales, Lat & account 54.30. N Long 134.40.

Wednesday July 13th
Commenced with strong winds at Smith
fog and rain. Ship leading Wh. off saw 5 Ship
at anchor saw Whales toward to no purpose
saw one of the Stanton Islands. bearing N.W.
middle part strong winds at N. with fog and rain
latter part light winds at N. at 11 A.M. reached
close to the Land. 9 fathoms Water saw Whales
toward to no purpose. Lat & account 54.25. N Long 134.25. E.

Thursday July 14th
Commenced with light winds at N. Ship a
Anchor Boats off got one Whale. Middle and
latter parts haphing winds and weather at daylight
sent 2 Boats in and commenced cutting off. finished
sent the 1st Boat in. saw several Whales
to no purpose.

Friday July 15th
Commenced with light winds at N. Boats
in shore. saw Whales very shy got Nothing. Middle
and latter parts haphing. no Whales in sight.

Saturday July 16th
Commenced with strong winds at N.E. Boats
off. middle part strong winds at N.E. with lightning.
2 Boats stole on shore. latter part more moderate
rain. Whales got Nothing.

Sunday July 17th
Commenced with light winds at N.E. Boats
in shore. saw Whales got Nothing. Middle and
latter parts light haphing winds saw Whales
to no purpose. Employed Boiling.

Monday July 18th
Commenced with light winds at N. Boats
off. finished Boiling. middle part thick fog
latter part calm Boats off saw Whales got Nothing.

Tuesday July 19th
Commenced with a calm Boats in shore. saw
Whales to no purpose. Middle and latter parts calm
with thick fog saw Whales got Nothing.

Wednesday July 20th
Commenced with a calm and fog squalls Boats
off saw Whales killed one Whale & this from
the Ship at 7 P.M. the wind blowing a fresh
gale hauled the Whale. Middle and latter
parts fresh gales at N.E. with thick fog
and rain at 2 A.M. got the Ship under
sail to get the Whale.
