

Sunday March 4th

Commences with strong gales at N.W. heading
W. & W. Middle and latter part haphling winds
and squalls from W. to N.W. heading N.W. to
S.E. 3, saw nothing

Lat & lon 32.24. N. Long & thro 72.27. W.

Monday March 5th

Commences with strong winds at N.W. by S. heading
W. & S. Middle part variable latter part Calm, saw
one sail. Spoke some Saals. found the fore yard strong
and likewise rotten

Lat & lon 32.16. N. Long & thro 72.00. W.

Tuesday March 6th

Commences with a Calm, Employed in fixing
the fore yard. Middle part light winds at S. Latter
part strong gales at S.W. steering N.W. All found
sail set at 10 A.M. part a Chumbe belong to
Philadelphia heading to the Southward, at noon
part Brig senton Manhattan heading Southward

Lat & lon 34.12. N. Long & thro 72.44. W.

Wednesday March 7th

Commences with strong gales at S.W. steering
N.W. Middle part hard squalls from S.W. Latter
part all sorts of weather squalls from S.W. with
Calms had a tempest of Thunder and lightning
and heavy showers of rain, saw 2 sail

No. 2 Lat & lon 36.35. N. Long 72.50. W.

Thursday March 8th

Commences light haphling winds and Calms with
Thunder and lightning and rain, at 5 P.M. the
wind commenced blowing in furious gusts for 4 hours
from S.W. to N. and then settling down to a hard
gale at N.W. Split the Main Top Sail Ship bore
to under beam Puffs, with a tremendous running
back with hard gales at N.W. Ship heading W. & S.

No. 2 Lat & lon 36.22. N. Long 73.10. W.

Friday March 9th

Commences with strong gales at N.W. heading
W. & S. sail in sight, middle part light and haphling
latter Calms with haphling winds from N.W. to W. & S.
saw 2 sail, Employed repairing the Main
Top Sail, Lat & lon 37.27. N. Long account 73.20. W.

Saturday March 10th

Commences with strong winds at S. with thick
rainy weather steering N. Employed repairing
the Main Top sail, finished and bent it in a rain
storm, middle part variable, at Midnight it blowing
a hard gale at N.W. Ship under storm sails, heading
N.E. at 4 A.M. shivered the Topmasts, Star sail in ribbons
latter part hard gales with squalls harder at N.W.
with a driving rain storm Ship under bear Puffs
with a tremendous sea running, washed away
the Mast bar and Box, and every movable
article on Deck the seas making a complete
breach over the Ship, saw nothing. No. 2

Lat & lon account 38.30. N. Long 72.40. W.

Sunday March 11th

First and Middle part hard gales and squalls harder
with a high sea running Ship under bear Puffs
her Deck flooded with water all the time, the
wind from N.W. to N.E. Ship heading N.E. latter
part more moderate, more Ship to the Westward
altho it is blowing a hard gale at times the seas
breaking against the Ship with great fury and
over her the Decks flooded most of the time, saw
one vessel, No. 2. Lat & lon account 38.40. N. Long 72.05. W.
