wether from the N E ship under all sail steering
N W by N hands employed in washing ship
and painting latter part the same so ends this

Friday

March the 31

this day commences with strong breeze and pleasant
wether from the N E ship under all sail steering W
by N hands employed in breaking out for
water miller part the same latter part heavy
calm so ends this day

APRIL Saturday the 1

this day commences with lile breeze and pleasant
wether from the N E ship under all sail steering
N by N miller part the same latter part
wind from the south so ends this day

April the 2

this day commences with lile breeze and pleasant wether
from the N E ship under all sail steering W by N
middle part the same latter part with from the
S bit light so ends this day

Monday

April the 3

this day commences with lile breeze and pleasant
wether from the N E ship under all sail steering
W by N at 8 AM saw the land bearing N W
latter part the same so ends this day

Tuesday

April the 4

this day commences with strong breeze and pleasant
wether from the N E ship under all sail steering
W by N at 8 AM saw the land coming to an anchor
at 11 rest of the day broke out for cash and sent
a raft ashore a number of ships went to sea
so ends this day

Wednesday

April the 5

this day commences with pleasant wether employed in
breaking out oil and putting id on board of the
ship L B Palmer of New York put on board 195
barrels and carried 89 bundles of shooks on shore
so ends this day in port

Thursday

April the 6 this day in port the Labboard watch
employed in painting ship the Stabboard watch on
liberty a number of ships came in to day so ends

Friday

April the 7 this day in port Labboard watch on liberty
got of a raft of water the stabboard watch employ
ed in painting ship so ends this day in port

Saturday

April the 8 this day in port Stabboard watch on
liberty took 50 barrels of potatoes on board stored
some water down so ends this day at anchor
