

Ship Speedwell of Fairhaven Round To The

Saturday May the 6 this day commences with lile breeze and pleasant wether from the S ship under all sail steering N by W hands employed in different jobs latter part strong breeze took in lile sails and double reef the fore and mizen topsails so ends this day

Sunday May the 7 this day commences with strong gale and pleasant wether from the S W the ship under close reef topsails and foresail steering N middle part took in fore and mizen topsails passed a ship a laying to latter part took in fore sail and liffed to the wind so ends

Monday May the 8 this day commences with strong and snow squalls from the N N W ship under the double reef maintop sail and foresail heading W latter part set the fore and mizen topsails and jib

Tuesday May the 9 this day commences with fresh breeze and pleasant wether from the N W ship under all sail heading N N E latter part wind from the S W steering N some raining so ends this day

Wednesday May the 10 this day commences with strong breeze and foggy wether from the S W ship under double reef topsails foresail jib steering N N W latter part moderate gale took in fore and mizen topsails and jib and close reef the maintop sail wind shifted to W N W so ends this day

Thursday May the 11 this day commences with strong gale and snow squalls from the N W the ship under close reef maintop sail heading N N E latter part the same so ends this day

Friday May the 12 this day commences with strong breeze and pleasant wether from the W N W the ship under double reef topsails and foresail N middle part the same

latter part more moderate set whole topsails jib and mainsail sail a sail so ends this day

Saturday May the 13 this day commences with strong breeze and a thick shower storm from the E the ship under whole topsails heading N W by N at 5 liffed to the wind double reefed the topsails took in jib and mainsail latter part took in fore and mizen topsails and close reef the main and reefed the foresail it blowing heavy wind a thick storm and cold so ends this day

Sunday May the 14 this day commences with strong gale and a grow storm from the N N W ship under close reef main topsail and foresail it blowing heavy heading N E at 7 A M took in foresail saw a sail laying too latter part wether better but blowing heavy so ends this day

Monday May the 15 this day commences with lile breeze and pleasant wether from the N N W ship under all sail heading W saw 3 sails at 4 P M captain went on board of the ship Massachusetts of New Bedford capt Bennett spoke the Mary of New Bedford so ends this day

Tuesday May the 16 this day commences with lile breeze and pleasant wether from the S W ship under whole topsails heading W saw a sail at 12 A M went in through the passage into the Cepachaba bay with the Mary and Massachusetts of New Bedford latter part double reefed the topsails it blowing strong so ends this day

Wednesday May the 17 this day commences with lile breeze and pleasant wether from the S ship under all sail steering N W by N hands employed in jobs about the ship saw a number of firelocks latter part the same so ends this day
