This day commences with a strong breeze and
rugged wether from the S E ship steering S W
by W under double reef top sails middle part
strong breeze ship laying two latter strong breeze
from the S E ship steering W S W under
double reef top sails so ends this day
Lab by 34-56

Wednesday the 5

this day commences with strong breeze and very
good wether from the S E ship steering W
S W under double reef top sails and still in sight
at night took in sail and left to the wind
middle part fresh breeze ship laying two latter
fresh light breeze from the S E ship steering
S W by S so ends this day
Lab by 33-49

Thursday the 6

this day commences with light breeze and pleasant
wether from the E ship heading S E under all
sails set bound to Mangrove the land in sight
the Cooper employed in setting up shacks to
for water middle and latter part calm the
land in sight one sail in sight
so ends this day
Lab by 37-35

Friday the 7

this day commences with light breeze and pleasant
wether from the Westward ship standing off and
on to the land got a sunfish got the cables and
bent them middle part light breeze ship heading
to the windward latter part light breeze
and pleasant wether from the S E the
ship heading up the land
so ends this day

Remarks on board Saturday March the 8

this day commences with strong breeze and rugged
wether from the S E ship working up the
took in light sails and double reef the top sail
3 sail in sight one barque one ship one brig middle
part strong breeze latter part strong breeze from
the E ship heading up to Mangrove
so ends this day

Sunday the 9

this day commences with strong breeze and
rugged wether from the E ship working up
to the land 2 sails in sight broke out a
pile of bread middle and latter part light
breeze heading in to the harbor at Mangrove
so ends this day

Monday the 10

this day commences with light breeze come to anchor
in port got a raft of coals on shore
middle part in port latter part employed in
getting off water so ends this day

Tuesday the 11

this day commences in port hands employed
in stowing down water these 24 barrels finish
so with getting water and wood so ends this day

Wednesday the 12

this day commences ~~with~~ in port employed
in stowing down water and wood latter
part getting water and potatoes so ends this day

Thursday the 13

this day commences in port employed in
stowing down water ~~and~~ and latter
part in port one watch above one
stove
so ends this day
