

Wednesday Sept 16th 1851,

Light breeze from N.W. all sail set
steering S.E. & N.E.

At 10 AM. the same,

(pleasant all sail set, course
continued, some sail to the South, but
not) at 1 PM. set sail, thus ends,
Latitude 38° 11' North,

Longitude

Thursday Sept 17th

Light breeze from N.W. all sail set steering
S.E. & N.E. at 2 PM. saw the Island
of Flores bearing N.E. about 12 miles at
5 PM. a hard squall of hail and wind,
Middle and Latter parts pleasant at day light
saw the Island of Fayal, bearing S.E. & S.W. & S.E.
thus ends,

Friday Sept 18th

Moderate breeze from N.W. all sail set
working towards Fayal, at 1 PM. landed
at 5 PM. a boat load of recruits, five
whalers at anchor ship rings and schooners,
and four off and on,
Middle and Latter parts wind light and baffling
at 9 PM. sent a boat on shore at 11 PM.
came on board, set all sail and steered S.W.

Saturday Sept 19th

Light breeze from West all sail set steering S.W.
Fayal bearing N.E. at dusk about 20 miles,
Middle and Latter part light air and
calm all sail set, ship heading Southward
all hands employed in ship duty
thus ends the day, and I wish I was
at home, if ever one man did I do,

Sunday Sept 20th 1851,

Light breeze from N.W. all sail set
by the wind South, at 1 PM. saw
of Fayal in sight bearing N.E. & N.W.
miles,
Middle and Latter parts light air,
the Western part all sail set steering
Southward, 80 miles,
Latitude 35° 44' South,

Monday Sept 21st

Moderate breeze and cloudy from N.W.
all sail set steering Southward,
sail in sight at 6 PM. spoke a
Peruvian of New Sevidon and men
from home, and is to be at home
July, and we shall not more than
where we are going by that time,
rather home sick, I don't think
would exchange with them, but cannot
the test I think not
Middle and Latter parts fine weather from West
course S.W. two sail in sight heading the same,
thus ends, and I feel very much alone,
Latitude 33° 06' North,

Tuesday Sept 22nd

Pleasant weather from N.W. all sail set steering
S.W. two sail in sight heading the same,
Middle part same squally with much rain,
Latter part much baffling, mostly from the
Northward, set the light sails course S.W.
thus ends, I feel rather in spirits to day, what
a difference it makes to a person if his mind
is only at ease, making of account to worry him,
