

Sunday Jan 3<sup>rd</sup> 1855

Fresh breeze and sandy from NW, inclining  
Moderate ship under double reefed top sails  
steering by the wind WNW at 3 P.M. wore  
ship to NE, and let the reef out of the top  
sails.

Middle part fresh breeze,  
Latter part pleasant weather wind from South,  
set all sail at 8 A.M. to the ESE,  
this noon, a man is almost half a furl  
to go whaling these days.

Latitude 44° 21' South,  
Longitude 58° 00' West.

Monday Jan 4<sup>th</sup>

Moderate breeze from South, all sail set  
steering ESE by the wind, at 6 P.M. calm,  
at dark took in sail.

Middle part wind from NW,  
Latter part fresh breeze at 5 P.M. made sail  
and kept off South, at 11 wind from WNW,  
and both double reefed the top sails, this noon,  
I think by the appearance of things we are  
about making it more out of this.

Latitude 45° 19' South,  
Longitude 58° 00' West.

Tuesday Jan 5<sup>th</sup>

Fresh breeze from SSW, ship under easy  
sail steering by the wind SE at 2 P.M.  
wore ship to NW under the fore top sail  
and bent another one, at 7 P.M. tacked to  
South, Middle part moderate.

Latter part wind backing with much rain  
hauled light sails, this noon.

Wednesday Jan 6<sup>th</sup> 1855

Moderate breeze and pleasant weather from  
ESE, all sail set steering SSW at 8 P.M.  
calm.

Middle part wind from NE, at 4 P.M. rain,  
Latter part strong breeze from NE, to  
East at 9 A.M. rain held up, course SSW,  
this noon.

Latitude 46° 25' South,  
Longitude 61° 40' West.

Thursday Jan 7<sup>th</sup>

Strong breeze from East at 2 P.M. more  
moderate set all sail course SSW  
at 4 wind SE, took in the low part  
and lashed her on the top works.

Middle part moderate ship, on different tack,  
Latter part pleasant weather from WNW,  
all sail set steering South, took in  
water, and mending fore top sail, this noon.

Latitude 47° 39' South,  
Longitude 62° 27' West.

Friday Jan 8<sup>th</sup>

Fresh breeze from WNW, all sail set steering  
SSW at 6 P.M. set top mast stunsail  
Middle part moderate until 4 P.M. then  
squall from SSW took in sail to double  
reef top sails, at 5 pleasant again made sail.

Latter part, at 10 P.M. wind came on  
but end foremast and clear weather from  
SSW took in sail to double reef top  
sails, hauled jib and main sail, one sail  
in sight off our weather bow, this noon.

Latitude 50° 20' South,  
Longitude 62° 24' West.
