

Saturday, March 20th 1858

Weather fair one watch on liberty, the other employed in painting ship, and other ship duties, thus ends,

Sunday, March 21st

Weather fair though the day one watch on liberty and what have I been doing, I have begun two letters, stop'd half of the afternoon, (Smart fellow) I cannot keep my mind on one thing long enough write a letter, more especially in this place,

Monday, March 22nd

Weather fair but cloudy one watch on liberty, the other employed in ship duties, thus ends,

Tuesday, March 23rd

Weather fair though the day got on board 43 fathoms chain and ran anchor from the shore, also 15 lbs sweet potatoes, thus ends

Wednesday, March 24th

Weather pleasant throughout the day one watch on liberty, the other employed variously went on shore myself in the evening and find the place has not altered much, it is what I call a miserable place, there is no place like home,

Thursday, March 25th

Weather fair but puffy which keeps the ship springing round till hands employed about the ship in small jobs, but I feel uneasy for it seems to me that I have got the most miserable set that I ever had,

Friday, March 26th 1858

Weather fair took on board a small cask of water and stowed it away and got cleaned up a little for sea, took on board two of our sick men which are now well, and two new ones ship'd here, also two from the lost runaways, that is the way that trouble begins and here, men run away take them on board put them in irons,

Saturday, March 27th

A day's light hove up the anchor and drifted out the was, foul and that gave us a small job and the heads blowing at gale, but got things straight and lay off sea,

Sunday, March 28th

Strong trades at 8 P.M. the Capt and Lady came on board, kept West by N. for Waikiki, Middle and Litter part the same, at 8 A.M. Capt and Lady went on shore at Waikiki, thus ends,

Monday, March 29th

Fresh trades ship under easy sail laying off and on, Middle and Litter part much the same, thus ends,

Tuesday, March 30th

Fresh trades ship under easy sail off and on,

Wednesday, March 31st

Strong trades at 4 P.M. the Capt and Lady came on board, lay up and stowed 8 M. Middle and Litter the same, at 8 A.M. landed at Attoe to trade, thus ends,
