

Thursday April 1st 1858

Strong trades at 2 P.M. got all aboard and started off S.W. by W. West. Middle and Latter part much the same, course West true sail in sight. Thus ends, Latitude 21° 52' North,

Friday April 2nd

Strong breeze from E. by S. all sail set steering N.W. by S. sent the top gallant sheet sail boom off the yards, and sail in sight. Middle part moderate with some showers, Latter part light wind course West gaining with the Champion of Edgartown. Unlaid the mizen top gallant sail to ground. Latitude 22° 00' North,

Saturday April 3rd

Moderate breeze from N.E. all sail set course West, gaining with the Champion, but the mizen top gallant sail and unlaid the main sail, two other sail in sight. Middle and Latter part much the same, finished and bent the main sail, got water and Molasses. Thus ends, Latitude 22° 16' North,

Sunday April 4th

Moderate breeze and cloudy from East all sail set steering West. Middle and Latter part the same, course continued. Thus ends. have been reading letters and it makes me love home and home sick.

Latitude 22° 46' North
Longitude 171° 18' West,

Monday April 5th 1858

Light wind from East all sail set steering West. Middle and Latter part the same, unlaid the main top sail to mend. Thus ends, Latitude 23° 17' North,

Tuesday April 6th

Light breeze from East course W.N. by S. employed mending the main top sail. Middle part the same, Latter part fresh breeze finished and bent the main top sail, unlaid the jib to repair. Thus ends, Latitude 23° 47' North, Longitude 176°

Wednesday April 7th

Fresh breeze from East all sail set steering W.N. by S. and sail in sight. Middle and Latter part light wind from the same point took in the W. Boat to mend, at 8 P.M. was spoken by bark Vigilant of New Bedford, broke out for flour, butter, tea and water. Thus ends, Latitude 23° 47' North, Longitude 179° 16' West,

Thursday April 8th

Light air from Eastward, all sail set steering W.N. by S. gaining with the Vigilant, finished the W. Boat and put her in the crans. Middle part light air and calm. Latter part wind backing, squally weather. all sail set heading Westward, thus ends,
