

Saturday May 1st 1858

Moderate breeze from SSE, ship head
east, yawning with the Irish Seas, rain
sail and hoist at times,
middle part thick snow storm at 1 o'clock
and shifted to WNW and blow'd on to
at gale, with snow,
Latter part fresh gale and clear from
WNW, ship, have too head North, thus ends,
Latitude 57° 35' North,
Longitude 167° 11' East,

Sunday May 2nd

Fresh gale and clear weather from WNW
ship, have too head North, at 6 o'clock,
more moderate, set fore sail and let one
reef out of the M. S. Sail, thus sail in
sight at dark,
middle part moderate at 3 o'clock,
set all sail, head by the wind North,
Latter part blew out wither at 10 o'clock
from WNW, steered WNW by the wind,
Latitude 58° 02' North,
Longitude 167° 27' East

Monday May 3rd

Moderate breeze and clear from WNW, all sail
set, steering WNW, thus sail in sight
at 6 o'clock, wind SSE, fresh cloudy and
cold, at 7 o'clock in sail to two double
reef, S. sails and were shifted to SE,
middle part strong breeze, at 3 o'clock,
more ship to the North,
Latter part moderate at 7 o'clock, reef of M. S. sails,
and set all sail, one sail in sight, thus ends,

Tuesday May 4th 1858,

Moderate breeze and snow squalls from
West all sail set steering by the wind
WNW at 6 o'clock, tacked to South,
middle and latter parts good wither
gamed with the Marango, at noon
wind shifted to SSE, and thickening
up four sail in sight, thus ends,
Latitude 58° 31' North,

Wednesday May 5th

Fresh breeze from SSE, all sail set
head Eastward, gaming with the
Marango, the land in sight
bearing WNW gaming with the
Marango, at 6 o'clock, fresh gale
with thick snow storm, double reef
the S. sails and pushed courses,
at 9 o'clock, last reef the S. sails,
middle part fresh and thick snow storm,
Latter part moderate with snow at 8
o'clock, we ship to West, at 10 we again
to Eastward, thus ends,

Thursday May 6th

Fresh gale and clear weather from WNW,
ship under easy sail steering by the wind
South, at 2 o'clock, was spoken by the
Harmony of New London, seen nothing
at 4 was spoken by Ship Brasfords of
New Bedford, both off East,
middle part the same,
Latter part moderate all sail set, stand
by, at 10 sail in sight, at 10 o'clock, saw
considerable ice, thus ends,
Latitude 59° 05' North,
Longitude 171° 00' East,
