

Sunday June 13th 1838

Fresh gale and thick weather from N.E. ship under last reefed top sail heading E.S.E. at 6 more moderate commenced sailing. Middle part more moderate with light rain. Latter part moderate with thick fog at 11 o'clock, gained with the Brauseman, thus ends.

Monday June 14th

Fresh breeze and thick weather ship under easy sail on different tacks, gaining with the Brauseman, at 8 o'clock, finished sailing. Middle part much the same. Latter part, at 10 o'clock, fog let up, saw the ice and fine sail, rainy weather thus ends.

Tuesday June 15th

Strong breeze and rainy from N.E. ship under easy sail on different tacks saw fine sail. Middle and Latter parts moderate but foggy, most of the time broke out the main hole to show sail several ships in sight gained with the field thus ends.

Wednesday June 16th

Light wind and clear from Westward all sail set heading Northwesterly, finished stowing 120 lbs oil, plenty of ice and several sail in sight. Middle part moderate and some fog, Latter part fresh breeze and clear all sail set on different tacks, off and on the ice took the broken part out of the try work and set another one thus ends.

Thursday June 17th 1838

Strong breeze and clear weather from West all sail set heading Eastward at 6:30 P.M. tacked to W.N.W. 1/2 S. of ice in sight at 5 o'clock Cape Thaddeus bearing W.N.W. sail in sight. Middle and Latter parts moderate but thick same of the time at 7 o'clock, the land W.N.W. about 4 miles, spoke ship William Tell of Sag Harbor at 10 o'clock fog wore ship to E.S.E. at 11 o'clock, thus ends.

Friday June 18th

Moderate breeze and foggy some of the time, at 6 P.M. saw the ice at 7 o'clock tacked to North, gained with the field and Omega, Middle and Latter parts fresh breeze, and cloudy, some of the time thick and some of the time snow all sail set stowing by the wind, Northwesterly, three sail in sight, thus ends.

Saturday June 19th

Moderate breeze and thick weather from N.E. all sail set stowing by the wind at 1 P.M. tacked to East, three sail in sight, at 4 o'clock off, at 7 o'clock tacked to W.N.W. 1/2 S. is the 18 of June and plenty of ice and no whales. Middle and Latter parts fresh breeze and clear from the same quarter, all sail set ship on different tacks working North, several sail in sight, thus ends.
