

Sunday June 20th 1858

Light wind and clear weather from WNW, all sail set heading WNW, two sail in sight at 6 P.M. wind S.W. stand

about

Middle part the same, Latter part fresh breeze from South all sail set steering by the wind ESE at 7 P.M. saw Cape Breton, bearing 110, 12 sail in sight and plenty of ice, at noon tacked to WNW, Latitude 64.00 North,

Monday June 21st

Fresh breeze and clear from South all sail set heading by the wind WNW several sail in sight at 3 P.M. passed with the one of Fairhaven, at 4 P.M.

Middle part the same,

Latter part strong breeze thick rugged cold weather, main top gallant sail and courses out driving her, if the wind should come from opposite quarter I don't know but he would beat to windward then, thus ends,

Tuesday June 22nd

Strong breeze and rugged thick weather from South, under 3 sails, and courses standing by the wind WNW at 3 P.M. double reefed the top sails, at 4 hauled jib and main sail, at 7 last reefed the fore top sail and wore ship to ESE

Middle and Latter part about the same, set jib and main top sail, I think this will hold for a rugged ice season, for we seem to have plenty of boats, thus ends, I am homesome and due to talk with I wish I was at home sitting by the side of some good woman, what say you old A.M.

Tuesday June 22nd 1858,

Strong breeze and rugged thick weather from SE, ship under double reefed 3 sails and jib, heading by the wind SSW at 3 P.M. snow and rain, hard water for some I think,

Middle part more moderate but thick fog, Latter part more moderate at 8 P.M. fog let up a little set all sail and steamed by the wind South, saw two sail, thus ends,

Wednesday June 23rd

Moderate breeze and thick weather from East all sail set steering SSE, one sail in sight

Middle and Latter part light wind and thick fog, at 11 P.M. saw the ice more ship to Westward, at noon let up a little, saw two sail, thus ends,

Thursday June 24th

Light wind from Southward all sail set heading Westward, the ice and two sail in sight, gave a with the Manago at 8 P.M. thick fog,

Middle and Latter part moderate breeze and more all sail set steering Southward, along the ice, thus ends, Latitude 62.20 North, Longitude 78.30 West,

Friday June 25th

Moderate breeze and cloudy from South all sail set steering Southward along and across twice at 6 P.M. gave with the William, G. & Co. at 7 saw low heads caused the boats could not get hold, Middle and Latter part light wind and thick fog, lay aback most of the time saw the William, G. & Co. and plenty of ice, thus ends,
