

Saturday June 26th 1835

Light wind and thick same of the time, ship
lost to the ice again with the William, Giffey,
two other sail in sight
Middle and Latter part moderate breeze from
SW and SSW and thick fog ship on different
tacks, this ends,

Sunday June 27th

Fresh breeze and a thick dense fog from SSW
ship heading WNW at 3. 30 hauled light
sails, at 3.30 wore ship to SSE and reefed
fore and mizen top sails.

Middle and Latter part light wind and
thick fog, headed Eastward though the Latter part
this ended, felt rather lone some and a little
home sick, to day, what means that McAll,

Monday June 28th

Light wind and thick fog from SSE, ship
heading East, at 3 P.M. fog let up a couple
of hours, saw plenty of ice, and one sail,
Middle and Latter part thick fog, at 4 P.M.
saw a whale lowered two boats but saw no
more of him, this ends,

Tuesday June 29th

Moderate breeze and thick dense fog from
East ship in and about the ice, it seems
to me foolish to be amongst the ice when there is
nothing to be gained by it spoke ship Georgian
of New Bedford, she reports the loss of the
French ship Napoleon this morn saw her,
Middle part the same,

Latter part wind the same, at 9 A.M. fog let
up and small rain saw whale lowered the
boats but no success, this ends thick same
weather and a plenty of ice, let me get sleep
of this and I will stop clear don't seem to be
satisfied unless he is amongst the ice

Wednesday June 29th 1835

Moderate breeze and thick weather from ENE
ship on different tacks, to much ice in
sight for my use, at 1 P.M. shut down
thick fog, fog, fog, I almost wish sometimes
that I was a fool, the saying is them that know
nothing fear nothing, as for this ice I am afraid of
it and furthermore, I do not believe that it will
all disappear this season, the sun is at her highest
declination, and has turned to go South, one thing
is certain I cannot help it, but I wish the Capt
was as afraid of ice as I am, the ship would
not be amongst it so much when there was
a chance to keep clear of the hard stuff, for
it is as hard as a rock,

Middle part fog with rain,

Latter part thick fog, ship atack on different
tacks, considerable ice around, this ends,

Thursday July 1st

Moderate breeze and thick fog from E, ship
lying atack, at 1 P.M. let up a little steered
by the wind WNW

Middle part the same,

Latter part calm and thick fog let up
and for about half an hour, then thick
again, I am tired of this kind of business
I should not care so much about the fog
if it was not for this confounded ice, it
is worse than land for you don't know
where it is until you see it and here
it is the first of July and any quantity
of it about yet, it seems to me as though
it could not disappear before ice begins
to make again, but I hope for the best
and look on the black side I expect that
is natural for me,
