matter any by borrowing trouble about it,
if there had been good wholesome rules enforced
from the head things would be better, but if
it comes to hand I am not obliged to stand
it for there is other ships sails the Ocean
as well as this, and I can leave as well as
other,

Saturday Oct 2nd

Fresh breeze and pleasant weather from E.S.E.
all sail set steering South, at 6 P.M. set
top mast stud sail,
middle and latter part fresh trade from
East all sail set steering South, all hands,
employed washing ship inside, thus ends,
one more night of tolerable quietness and
then I suppose the howles will come faster,
but I shall try not to let the thought
of it keep me awake, to night anyhow,

Sunday Oct 3rd 1858

Fresh trade and pleasant weather from E.S.E.
all sail set steering S.W. at 11 P.M. left
off ship,
A. & Mill, took a Pilot, at 9 took
the steamer and was towed into Wharves
and made fast along side the ship, Sky Sack,

Monday Oct 4th

Pleasant weather all hands employed taking
ail and putting it on board the Sky Sack
at 11 P.M. finished taking out ail,

Tuesday Oct 5th

Pleasant weather all hands employed bundling
bone, at 5 P.M. finished, and shipped
it on board the Sky Sack,
thus ends, W

Wednesday Oct 6th

Good weather, hauled off from the Sky Sack
and moved the ship, and got off a
raft of water,

Thursday Oct 7th

Pleasant weather tipped the ship down by the
stern to mend the copper, one watch
an liberty,

Friday Oct 8th

Pleasant weather, one watch an liberty
the other employed stowing off the fore
hole,
