

Saturday Oct 9th 1838

Pleasant weather one watch on liberty
the other employed filling salt water,

Sunday Oct 10th

Pleasant weather one watch on liberty

Monday Oct 11th

Pleasant weather one watch on shore the
other employed in ship's duty,

Tuesday Oct 12th

Pleasant weather one watch on shore
the other employed stowing off the
main hold

Wednesday Oct 13th

Rainy most of the day all hands
employed in ship's duty, great haste to
get to sea again, in the morning
found 1 man missing,

Thursday Oct 14th

Fresh trades at 9 A.M. began to unmoor
at 2 finished Pilot came on board
and the steam tug hooked on to us
and towed us outside, thus ended,

Friday Oct 15th

Fresh trades lay off and on at 9 A.M.,
boat came from shore and brought us
4 barrels of ship's beer,
thus ended,

Saturday Oct 16th

Fresh trades lay off and on, at 4
P.M. Capt. and Lady came on
board, set all sail and started
S.E. & E. eight men short,
caught none of our runaways,

Sunday Oct 17th 1838

Wind light and baffling from the Eastern
board all sail set staving S.E. & E.
middle and latter part much the same,
I begin to come to myself again, now
and I feel rather uneasy, I wish I had
left the ship as I think I could have
done better, and got with better folks,

Monday Oct 18th

Wind light and baffling from the Eastern
board all sail set staving S.E. & E.,
middle part much the same,
latter part strong trades, from E. & E.
took in top mast stay, sail fly jills
fore and main, S.E. sails, broke out
the after hole for better, at noon reefed
the main S.E. sail, thus ended,

Tuesday Oct 19th

Strong trades from E. & E. all prudent
sail set staving S.E. &
middle and latter part some squally
course continued, thus ended,

Latitude 13° 46' N. alt.

Longitude 58° 55' W. alt.

Wednesday Oct 20th

Strong trades from E. & E. all sail set
staving S.E. &
middle part the same,
latter part squally, at noon hauled
light sails thus ended, it is laughable
for a man to notice how things goes
at times on ship board, but it generally makes
us feel, I want no more work in
ships that I sail in. S.E. & E. alt.
