

Monday Nov 22nd 1858

Moderate breeze and cloudy from the North,
all sail set steering Eastward, fine sail
in sight, at dark took in sail,
middle part fresh breeze,
Latter part strong breeze at day light
made sail, at 4 A.M. double reefed the
fore and main Sails, at 8 keep
off E.S.E., 7 sail in sight, thus ends,
Latitude 36° 24' South,
Longitude 163° 35' West.

Tuesday Nov 23rd

Strong breeze and clear from the North,
ship under double reefed Sails, steering
S.E. at 6 P.M. gam'd with the Saratoga
and Geo. Howland, the latter fine
whale, the former just got on the ground,
at dark hauled fore and main Sails,
middle and latter parts strong breeze
at 5 A.M. set S.S. Sails, steered direct
course, saw nothing, thus ends,
Latitude 37° 08' South,

Wednesday Nov 24th

Strong breeze from North, ship heading
Eastward at 1 P.M. wind shifted to
Southward with rain,
middle and latter part moderate,
at day light set all sail, steered
Eastward, saw fine backs, the Saratoga
and George Howland in sight,
thus ends, the whaling would go
very well if a man could get the
the same pay whether he got oil or not
they I should like it.
Latitude 37° 27' South,
Longitude 162° 08' West.

Thursday Nov 25th 1858

Moderate breeze from Southward all
sail set steering Eastward, saw two whales,
gang quick, did not lose, saw a ship
at head whaling, at dark took in sail,
middle part wind shifted to N.W.,
Latter part strong breeze at day light
set all sail, at 8 keep off E.S.E. at
10 saw two whale, lowered the boats,
struck one, thus sail in sight,
thus ends, rigged whaling

Friday Nov 26th

Strong breeze and rigged from Northward
at 1 P.M. got the whale to the ship,
got dinner and hooked on, finished
at 6, rigged work, but we have been lucky
about haling, was spoken by the architect
of New London,
middle and latter part fresh breeze, at
7 A.M. set fore and main Sails, double
reefed, steered by the wind S.W. two sail
in sight, commenced haling, thus ends,
Latitude 37° 58'

Saturday Nov 27th

Fresh breeze and cloudy from N.W. ship
under double reefed Sails, steering by
the wind N.W. at 6 P.M. spoke ship
Geo. Howland with her sixth whale
along side,
middle part the same,
Latter part light wind with some rain
at 7 A.M. finished haling, saw
three sail, thus ends,
Latitude 38° 20' South,
