

Thursday Jan 6th 1883

Fresh breeze and thick weather from WNW,
and a heavy swell from SW. Ship
under easy sail head SW.
Middle part wind shifted to SSE.
Latter part strong breeze at 7 A.M.
finished hauling, and wore ship Eastward,
at 10 set double reef Sails, thus ends,
Latitude 47° 06' South,
Longitude 149° 17' West.

Friday Jan 7th

Strong breeze from SSW, ship under double
reef Sails, heading Eastward at dark,
wore ship to West and took in sail.
Middle and latter part strong gale,
with frequent squalls from SSW, ship,
hove too head West, thus ends.

Saturday Jan 8th

Strong gale from SSW, ship hove too
under last reef W.S. Sail, and top mast
stay sail head West.
Middle part much the same.
Latter part more moderate set double
reef S Sails, headed Westward stand
an' sail in the fore room, saw
two sail, thus ends,
Latitude 46° 30' South,
Longitude 149° 55' West.

Sunday Jan 9th 1883

Moderate breeze from S, weather clear,
under S Sails heading Westward at
2 P.M. wore ship to Eastward
at 6 spoke ship Rouseau, at
dark took in sail.
Middle part wind WNW and fresh.
Latter part fresh gale, stood off SSE at
noon hove too head SSW, thus ends,
Latitude 47° 34' South,

Monday Jan 10th

Strong gale and cloudy from West ship,
hove too head SSW.
Middle part more moderate.
Latter part pleasant weather set all sail,
at 8 A.M. stayed off East then sail in
sight, hove the S.S. Sail, and hove An-
son, thus ends,
Latitude 47° 57' South,
Longitude 147° 17' West.

Tuesday Jan 11th

Moderate breeze and clear from WNW, all
sail set standing East, then sail in sight
at 6 P.M. hove too with the Gay Head,
Rouseau, and Anah, at dark took in
sail.
Middle and latter part fresh gale at
7 A.M. stood off W.E. thus ends,
