

Wednesday Jan 26th 1859

Broke large from East all sail set
steering W by N, at 6 P.M. saw a
small Island name unknown, kept off
W by N

Middle and latter part much the
same, passed Tahiti and Enio
took in the S Boat and put out
another, sent the chains and put
the anchors off the bow, thus ends,

Thursday Jan 27th

Made large from East all sail
set steering for Heaone, at dark
handed light sails, head off, and
gained with the breeze, at
middle and latter part the same,
at 9 P.M. took a pilot and
got the ship in side and made
fast to the pier,

Friday Jan 28th

Pleasant weather, got a raft of coals
on shore, and got ready to move
ship, at 10 A.M. started,

Saturday Jan 29th

Pleasant weather at 7 P.M. off Heaone
in the afternoon stowed down some
oil

Sunday Jan 30th

Pleasant weather all hands on shore,

Monday Jan 31st 1859,

All hands employed breaking out
and stowing oil,

Tuesday Feb 1st

All hands employed breaking out
and stowing wood and water,

Wednesday Feb 2nd

All hands employed getting off wood
and water,

Thursday Feb 3rd

All hands employed getting off wood,
finished at sun down,

Friday Feb 4th

One watch on liberty, sent down
the main yard, employed fitting
a new one, I have been on shore
every night since we have been, and
hauled hawlines pretty tight

Saturday Feb 5th

Some squally one watch on liberty
the other employed washing ship
ready for painting,

Sunday Feb 6th

All hands on shore,

Monday Feb 7th

Washed and partly painted the ship
outside, one watch on liberty,
