

Tuesday April 12th 1859,

Strong breeze and rain from N.E. inclining
westerly, at 1 P.M. hauled fore and
mizen Sails, and wore ship E. & E.,
middle part the same.

Latter part wind N.W. and inclined
to moderate, set S.T. Sail, double reefed,
broke the fore hole for slops, to clothe
the sailors, and some of them are not
worth a suit of clothes, the hardest set
to be called sailors that I was ever with,
they are a disgrace to the name and
ship, so say I, G. B.

Wednesday April 13th

Strong breeze and cloudy from N.W. under
double reefed Sails, and fore sail head
N.E. middle and latter parts strong breeze,
and fog squalls from the same point
at 3 P.M. hauled S.T. Sail.

Latitude 37° 00' North,

Thursday April 14th

Strong breeze and cloudy from N.W. under
double reefed S.T. Sail, and fore
sail head N.E.

Middle and latter part more moderate
made sail, unless the S.T. Sail, to
mend,

Thus ends,

Friday April 15th 1859

Moderate breeze from N.W. all sail set
steering N.E., finished and bent the main
top sail,

Middle and latter part moderate, all sail
set working northward, thus ends,

Saturday April 16th

Moderate breeze and pleasant weather from

S.W. all sail set steering North, sent down
the main royal yard

Middle and latter part fresh breeze and
cloudy from South, course N.W., thus ends,

Sunday April 17th

Fresh breeze and cloudy from South, all
sail set steering North,

Middle part moderate

Latter part wind S.S.E. with some fog squalls,

Monday April 18th

Fresh breeze and cloudy from S.S.E. all sail
set steering North,

Middle part heaving on hauled light sails
at 6 A.M. double reefed the S.T. Sails

Latter part strong breeze and thick rain,
weather from S.S.E. course N.W., thus ends,

Tuesday April 19th

Strong breeze and thick from S.S.E. under double
reefed S.T. Sails, steering North, at 3 P.M. hauled
off made sail,

Middle and latter part fresh breeze came
clear from S.E. thus ends the day
