

Friday April 29th 1839,

Strong gale and cloudy with a heavy sea from S.W. ship hove to head S.S.E. at 6 P.M. took in the bow boat and turned up the waist boat. Middle and Latter parts not so much wind but a heavy sea, thus ends,

Saturday April 30th

Fresh gale and a heavy swell from S.W. head S.S.E. at 4 P.M. set fore sail, at 5 set double reef Sails at 6 more to West at 7 set main sail. Middle part more moderate set all sail. Latter part moderate with fine rain started W.S.W. under all sail, thus ends,

Sunday May 1st

Light wind and cloudy from S.S.W. all sail set head West at 2 P.M. calm. Middle part calm most of the time. Latter part light breeze from Eastward, and thick fog, all sail set steering N.W. Latitude 54° 00' North, Longitude 146° 33' West,

Monday May 2nd

Fresh breeze and thick weather from S.S.E. all sail set steering N.W. at 6 P.M. took in sail to double reef S Sails, and hauled up W.R.E. Middle part strong wind at 5 A.M. hauled fore S Sail, and hauled by the wind E.S.E. Latter part fresh gale and thick, at 9 A.M. wind hauled to S.W. and clear off keel of W.R.E. by 6, and set fore sail, at noon double reef S Sails, thus ends, Latitude 55° 40' North,

Tuesday May 3rd 1839,

Strong breeze and clear from W.S.W. steering W.E. by E. at 6 P.M. set all sail. Middle and Latter parts fresh breeze hauled light sails, saw fin backs, thus ends,

Wednesday May 4th

Fresh breeze with some squalls of rain from S.W. under S Sails, steering W.E. by E. at 7 P.M. took in sail to double reef S Sails and wore ship to Westward, plenty of fin backs in sight. Middle part fresh breeze at 4 A.M. wore ship and started W.E. under all sail. Latter part blowing on at 8 A.M. hauled light sails, at 10 double reef the S Sails, hauled jibs and main sail, at 11 hauled fore and mizen S Sails, wind E.S.E. strong gale, Latitude 56° 27' North, Longitude 147° 20' West,

Thursday May 5th

Strong Gale and cloudy from E.S.E. at 1 P.M. hauled fore sail and lost reef the main top sail, wore ship to South, at 4 P.M. blowing heavy with rain, at 7 turned up the S Boat, and took in the main top sail. Middle and Latter parts heavy gale and dark rainy weather from E.S.E. hove too under main spencer and fore top mast stay sail, thus ends, Barometer 29.30.
