

Thursday May 12th 1889

Madcast breeze from SSW, all sail set
stung E. by the land about 30 miles
distant sight sail in sight
middle part wind Eastward stung by the wind
SSW
Latter part strong breeze and squally
at 7 A.M. tacked to NW, saw fin backs,

Friday May 13th

Strong breeze and cloudy from SE, all sail set
steering by the wind ESE at 1 P.M. gamed
with the Osmulgee, Euzespa, and Solar Star
at 2 double reef the Sails, at 4 more sh^{ts},
off shore the land about two miles, heavy swell
from SSW
middle part fresh gale at midnight hove too
head South
Latter part fresh gale and thick from ESE,

Saturday May 14th

Strong wind and thick weather from SE, at
3 P.M. set double reef sails stung by the
wind SSW
middle part moderate and foggy
Latter part strong breeze and fog most
of the time, saw the sail between fog
squalls at 10 in felle, at 11 hauled
fore sail, rigged wither and no whales,
I think I could take more comfort
at home, — what say you M.A.M.,

Sunday May 15th 1889

Strong breeze and rainy from SSW, ship, head
SSW
Latter part strong breeze and rainy from
SSW at 7 kept of W. at 10 gamed with
the Sahmaroo, thus ends,

Monday May 16th

Strong breeze and mugged though out the
day, gaming with the Sahmaroo, at 6
the Courser came down, report nothing
thus ends,

Tuesday May 17th

Sight sails from SSW and a heavy swell all
sail set stung NW, thus sail in sight
middle and latter part moderate breeze with
frequent showers, stand off W. fine sail
and the land in sight — thus ends,

Thursday May 18th

Strong breeze and cloudy from SE, all
sail set steering by the wind ESE, 9
sail in sight, at 2 P.M. in S. G. Sails
at 3 double reef the Sails, hauled
main sail, and stung of West at 6 fresh
gale with rain from ESE, close reef the
main S. Sail and lifted to head South,
middle and latter part more moderate
at 7 A.M. wore ship to ESE and
made sail at 10 fog let it litto, saw
a sail, after him, it proved to be
the uncad,
