

Thursday

Friday May 26<sup>th</sup> 1834

Strong breeze and thick rainy weather from ESE, under double reefed Sails, head N by E at 3 P.M. wore ship to South the land 6 miles off at 6 A gale hauled fore top sail and close reefed the main, Middle and Latter parts fresh breeze and cloudy

Friday May 27<sup>th</sup>

Light wind and cloudy from SE, all sail set heading in shot at 1 P.M. the land about 5 miles distant kept off NW four sail in sight, Cape Crook N.E. 6 miles at sun down, at 11 P.M. gained with Shannon and Montreal, fine through the rest of the day wind NW

Saturday May 28<sup>th</sup>

Clear and wither from Westward all sail set looking for fish, Middle and Latter parts wither variable, saw a number of sails,

Sunday June 29<sup>th</sup>

Strong breeze and cloudy from SSW all sail set steering by the wind West at 5 P.M. gained with the Gay Head, William Gifford, and Robert Edwards, Middle and Latter parts moderate and cloudy all sail set heading Westward the land and four sail in sight,

Monday June 30<sup>th</sup> 1834

Light airs and calm from SSW all sail set head West the land and 4 sail in sight at 3 P.M. had a gain with the William Gifford, Middle and Latter parts moderate breeze from WSW steering S by E the land and 4 sail in sight,

Tuesday May 31<sup>st</sup>

Strong breeze and cloud from WSW all sail set steering S by E at 3 P.M. kept off E by N, saw five sail at 7 P.M. gained with the Polar Star and Gay Head, Middle and Latter parts light airs and calm,

Wednesday June 1<sup>st</sup>

Light wind and cloudy from W by E all sail set steering SW at dark steering SW, spoke the Gay Head, Middle and Latter parts strong breeze and thick wither all sail set steering SW at 6:30 A.M. hauled up NW and more moderate,

Thursday June 2<sup>nd</sup>

Moderate breeze and clear and wither from ESE all sail set steering NW, saw a number of fin backs, at 5 P.M. gained with the Gay Head, at 9 P.M. saw a whale down boat and drove him off, Calm, Latter part strong breeze and clear from WSW, all sail set, at 10 kept off N.E. and set main royally, Mr St Eltes bearing N by E. by compass, at noon,
