

Sunday Nov 20th 1854

Strong trades and rigged from E. S. E.
Ship under present sail standing S. S. E.
Middle and Latter part much the
same, thus ends another day.
Latitude 14° 24' N. alt,

Monday Nov 21st

Fresh trades from E. S. E. standing S. S. E.
Middle and Latter part much the
same, employed mending old sails
chose boat crews, out of 14 men ships
not a Yankee amongst the lot, great
old coon for picking out men.
Latitude 16° 24' N. alt,

Tuesday Nov 22nd

Fresh breeze from East all sail set
standing S. S. E.
Middle and Latter part wind same
hauling, with squalls of rain handed
light sails. thus ends,

Wednesday Nov 23rd

First part hard rain, thunder and
lightning and fresh breeze at times
at 2 P.M. double reefed the I Sails,
at 4 calm, and cloudy.
Middle and Latter part moderate
breeze from East and cloudy, all
sail set standing S. S. E. unhooked the
mizen top gallant sail to mundy.
thus ends,

Thursday Nov 24th 1854

Fresh breeze and squally from East all
sail set standing S. S. E. at 3 P.M. hard
squall took in sail to double reefed I Sails,
middle and Latter part more moderate
set all sail, some rain squalls, wind
from E. to E. S. E. thus ends,

Friday Nov 25th

Moderate breeze from E. S. E. all sail set
standing by the main Sails.
Middle and Latter part wind S. E. standing
by the main S. S. W. saw a sail heading
the same as ourselves, broke out the after
hole and fletted some of the things off,
thus ends,

Saturday Nov 26th

Moderate breeze from S. E. all sail set
standing S. S. W. by the main.
Middle and Latter part much the same,
thus ends, I wish I was at home, I believe
I am the biggest fool that ever was about
some things.

Sunday Nov 27th

Moderate from S. E. all sail set standing
by the main S. S. W.
Middle part the same,
Latter part fresh breeze from E. S. E.
steary Sails by the main. I again home
sick got to thinking about home and
what a fool I have been, made me
home sick.
