

Thursday Dec 8th 1839,

Light breeze from S.E. all sail set steering by the wind S.S.W. at 11 P.M. tacked to East.

Middle and Latter part much the same, thus ends,

Friday Dec 9th

Moderate breeze from E.S.E. all sail set steering by the wind South. Middle and Latter part much the same, at midnight saw the Island of Wogaiti, at 8 A.M. layd to, and began to get of wood, thus ends,

Saturday Dec 10th

Moderate breeze from Eastward off and on at Wogaiti, at 11 P.M. all on board including Capt and Lady, and steved West at E.S.W. Middle and Latter part much the same, at 10 spoke the ship was hauled to Wogaiti, thus ends, Latitude 14.40 S. South,

Sunday Dec 11th

Light wind from East course S.W. gaining with the Co'sack, Middle and Latter part much the same, thus ends,

Monday Dec 12th

Light air from S.S.W. all sail set head West. Middle and Latter part much the same, thus ends,

Tuesday Dec 13th 1839,

Moderate breeze from South all sail set steering by the wind W.S.W. Middle and Latter part light wind from S.S.E. course S.W. set taught the main top mast back stays, and tacked them up first and that is hard work with such sailors as we have got, I would go one cruise for nothing to have, Sam Braley master of the ship.

Wednesday Dec 14th

Light air from S.S.E. all sail set steering S.W. Middle and Latter part much the same, course S.W. employed mending the main S. Sail, thus ends I am tired I want to get some more air, and see the end of this voyage, and go one more, and see if things could not go with some uniformity.

Thursday Dec 15th

Moderate breeze from East all sail set steering S.W. Middle and Latter part pleasant weather wind at E. course S.W. put a new heel shore in to the jill boom the old one being broke, thus ends, I hope we shall find some whale before long so all we shall have some of the right kind of work to do, and take some of the laziness out of some of us the older we grow the lazier we grow it seem to be so with some folks.
