

Monday Jan 2nd 1860

Moderate breeze from S.E., all sail set
standing S.S.W., two sail in sight, at
7 P.M. finished bailing
middle and latter part fresh breeze from
E.S.E. hauled light sails, thus ends,

Tuesday Jan 3rd

Fresh breeze from East, under easy sail
standing S.S.W., the Abraham Barker
in sight
middle and latter part much the same,
stowed 40 lbs oil between decks,
thus ends,

Wednesday Jan 4th

Moderate breeze from E.S.E., all sail
set standing S.S.W., at 4 P.M. gale
with the Abraham Barker, when I
go on board of another ship, and come
back on board of our own, it makes me
feel cross, I do not believe there is a
ship here that has got so miserably
cluttered as we have, and those that
had ought to be officers are the worst
middle and latter part fresh breeze,
course S.S.W., saw a number of seals,

Thursday Jan 5th

Moderate and cloudy from N.E., all sail set
standing S.S.W., the Abraham Barker in sight,
middle and latter part light wind and
smoky from N.E., course S.S.W.,
thus ends,

Friday Jan 6th 1860

Light air and cloudy from North all
sail set standing S.S.W.
middle and latter part wind S.W. and some
drizzle, steered S.S.E. by the wind, saw a
sail to the East, thus ends,

Saturday Jan 7th

Fresh breeze and cloudy from S.S.W. standing
by the wind S.E., at 4 P.M. double reefed
the fore and main Sails, at 6 reefed the
main,
middle part the same,
latter part more moderate set whole S
Sails, at noon were ship to N.S.W.,

Sunday Jan 8th

Strong breeze and cloudy from S.S.W.,
prudent sail set head reef, at 6 P.M.
double reefed the S.S. Sail and wore
ship to S.E.
middle and latter part more moderate set
all sail, thus ends,

Monday Jan 9th

Light wind from N.S.W. and a swell from South
all sail set head S.S.W.
middle and latter part fresh breeze from N.W.
course continued, at 4 P.M. hauled light
sails, thus ends, and no whales yet
I am fearful that we have come here
after the whales that was caught last season,
or expecting to find them here again,
