

Monday Jan 16th 1860

Fresh gale with rain from N.E. have
two head East at 4 P.M. wind hauled to
N.W. and more moderate wore ship to N.W.
and set double reefed fore and main top
sails.

Middle part moderate.

Latter part, at day light set all sail

stand by the wind Southward at 8 P.M.

saw the Snared, being N.W. at

9 heaving on hauled light sails and double

reefed the S Sails, at 11 in jib and

main sail, the Robert Edwards in sight,

Tuesday Jan 17th

Fresh gale from N.W. under easy sail

head N.W. the Snared N.W. 15 miles

at 7 P.M. at 8 wore ship Southward,

Middle part much the same

Latter part more moderate at 7 P.M.

wore ship to N.W. and set fore sail,

at 9 set fore top sail — thus ends,

Wednesday Jan 18th

Strong breeze from N.W. under double

reefed S Sails, and courses head N.W.

at 12:30 stood North, at 1 saw

Stewart's Island keep off N.E. at 4

gauge with the Robert Edwards,

at 7 hauled fore and main S Sails

and luffed by the wind Southward,

Middle part fresh gale inclining N.W. wind,

Latter part strong gale with squalls,

at 11 P.M. wore ship to North, the

Robert Edwards and one other sail

in sight

thus ends,

Thursday Jan 19th 1860

Strong gale with squalls from N.W. have

two under storm sail, head North,

Middle part more moderate,

Latter part moderate thick and rainy set

double reefed S Sails and Eastward saw

two sail, thus ends,

Friday Jan 20th

Fresh breeze from N.E. under easy sail head

Eastward, the Robert Edwards in sight, at

4 P.M. wind hauled to N.W. and blowing

on at 6 took in main top sail, and

turned up the S Boat at 7 blowing a

heavy gale, with tremendous gusts of wind,

the Barometer 29.20 at 8 P.M.

Middle part, at midnight more moderate, at

4 P.M. set close reefed main S Sail,

Latter part, wind from N.W. fresh gale, at

9 P.M. wore ship to Westward Barom 29.30

at 11 P.M. at 11:30 wind hauled to N.W.

and blew heavy, wore ship to North and took

in main top sail, Barom 29.00 at noon,

Saturday Jan 21st

First part heavy gale and clear from West, have

two under main spencers and fore top mast

stay sail head N.W. at 4 P.M. cloudy

and squally blowing heavy in squalls,

Barom 28.90 at 4 P.M.

Middle and latter part very heavy gale wind

N.W. I do not think that I ever saw

it blow harder than it does in the gusts, and

they blow about all the time, if I was at

home, and just think of these gales of wind

I rather think I should stop there, I believe

I am getting tired,

Barom steady at 29.00
