Thursday March 2 1869

Moderate breeze from N. E. all sail set steering
by the wind at N. E.

Middle part rain, squally.

Latter part light wind from N. E. at 5
A. M. saw the two Eastern masts of the
Navigation's bearing at 10 the natives
came off and amongst the rest there was
one that run away from the ship a year
ago at Fly-haul, took him on board
to give him a passage to the S. Islands,
may be I should have done the same, but
I think I should have given him a
passage over the side, something in haste,
I have been going some time, but this
keeps all that I ever saw, and dang sight
the most to blame where the head of affairs
ought to be, I wish the season was up, for
we shall not get enough to pay.

Friday March 3

Light wind from Eastward all sail set
head at N. E. the land S. E. 20 miles.

Middle part light wind from Eastward at N. E.

Latter part light wind from N. E. steering by
the wind at N. E. put another gill.

Saturday March 4

Light wind from East all sail set steering
at N. E. I hunt a new fly gill.

Middle and Latter part calm.
