

Thursday April 19th 1860

Fresh breeze from West all sail set staying mast, unhooked the S. S. sail, and bent another old one, at 8 hauled light sails at 6 P.M., thick fog.

Middle and Latter part moderate thick and rainy, wind hauled to S. E., thus ends,

Friday April 20th

Fresh breeze from N. E. and thick chilly weather, all sail set staying by the wind at 11 A.M. at 3 P.M. strong breeze reduced to double reef, Middle and Latter part breeze on to S. fresh gale took in sail to close reef, at 11 P.M. wind East, stand N. E., thus ends,

Saturday April 21st

Strong gale with thick rainy weather from E. S. E., ship heave too head N. E., Middle part the same.

Latter part moderate with heavy swell from South, stayed N. E. by E., thus ends,

Sunday April 22nd

Light wind and heavy swell from South, all sail set staying N. E.

Middle part moderate with snow.

Latter part fresh breeze and cloudy cold weather, all sail set head N. E. by E. wind S. E. if

I had once mistwakened that this ship was coming to those frozen regions this season, she would not have brought me, for we have not got oil enough in either of our other readings to pay me for what I have had to suffer with the cold, and the the thing is he has come here this season, because there was a few ships done well here last, and I consider our chance about gone for nothing, had character, and nothing to buy a good one with,

Monday April 23rd 1860

Strong breeze and rough cold cloudy weather from S. E. by E. at 2 P.M. double reef the S. S. sail at 3 hauled main sail at 6 P.M. at 7 closed reef the fore and main S. S. sails, ship head N. E. by E. by the wind.

Middle and Latter part moderate breeze from Southward, all sail set, course N. E., broke the fore hole for coal, thus ends, our oil has started to leaking, and we have got to break out and cooper, in these cold regions and that I do not fancy much,

Tuesday April 24th

Light breeze and cloudy from S. E. all sail set staying N. E. by E. Middle part breeze on from S. E. double reef the S. S. sail.

Latter part, fresh gale, at 8 P.M. in jibb and main S. S. sail, at 10 in S. S. sail, at noon hauled fore sail, closed reef the M. S. S. sail, and left by the wind heavy East, rainy chilly weather,

Wednesday April 25th

Strong gale and rainy from South, ship heave too head E. S. E., at 6 P.M. wind hauled to N. E. and clear off.

Middle and Latter part more moderate, at 6 A.M. keep off N. E. by E. and set double reef S. S. sail, at 9 set single reef, thus ends, another day on the less of this voyage, and that is some part and transactions of it that I should wish to forget, before it is ended if I could,
