

Thursday April 26th 1860

Strong breeze and cloudy from S.W. wind
sail set steering N.E. by E.
Middle and latter part more moderate
wind from South, to S.E. all sail set
steering N.E. by E. thus ends.

Friday April 27th

Fresh breeze and cloudy from S.E. all
sail set steering N.E.

Middle part light wind.

Latter part light and pleasant from N.W.
all sail set steering by the wind N.E. this wind,
the came and go, but still we see nothing.

Saturday April 28th

Light wind and cloudy from West all sail
set steering N.E. by E. put up our camp nest.
Middle part fresh breeze from S.W. at 11 o'clock
hauled light sails, and reefed fore and main
Sails, at 1 o'clock reefed the M.S. Sail,
Latter part blowing on, at 8 o'clock hauled fore
top Sail, at 9 o'clock reefed the main S. Sail,
at gale and snow storm, at 10 o'clock hauled
fore sail, had counting this, it means ought
to add about three years for every season that
he comes here, it will make an old man of it
young one in a short time.

Sunday April 29th

Strong gale with snow and rain from
South, under last reefed M.S. Sail, stand
about, at 7 P.M. have too head E. S. E.
Middle part rather more moderate wind N.W. by W.
Latter part more moderate at 7 o'clock
more ship, and started with, set fore
sail, at 10 o'clock, let one reef out
M.S. Sail, thus ends.

Monday April 30th 1860

Strong breeze and rugged cloudy weather
from West under double reefed S. Sail, standing
N.W. at 2 P.M. hauled two M.S. Sails
Middle part moderate wind hauled to
N.W. more ship, to N.W.

Latter part blowing on, a gale cloudy
cold weather at 7 P.M. hauled main sail
main S. Sail and jill, at 11 o'clock hauled
S.S. Sail, at noon hauled fore sail,

Tuesday May 1st

Strong gale and cold weather from N.W.
at 10:30 P.M. last reefed the M.S. Sail,
and more ship, to East, at 6 o'clock
snow storm with a gale, had weather and
a hard counting to look for whales come
here after whales we had ought to find
and get them and then it would not pay
Middle part hard gale until midnight then
more moderate wind hauled to N.W.

Latter part fresh gale cloudy cold weather from
N.W. at 7 A.M. set fore sail, at 10 o'clock
reef out of M.S. Sail, at noon set S.S. Sail,
this was the first day of May and in the room
of finding May flowers you will see ice about
the decks.

Wednesday May 2nd

Strong breeze and rugged cold weather from N.W.
under double reefed S. Sail, head of sail,
Middle part fresh breeze most of the time at 4
P.M. more ship, to S.W. and hauled S.S. Sail,
Latter part fresh breeze clear and cold ice made
all day, at 8 P.M. set fore and main S. Sails,
at 11 o'clock more ship, to N.W. had all sail set
out by noon, thus ends.
Latter part S.S. Sail at 1 o'clock
