

Thursday June 14<sup>th</sup> 1860

Moderate breeze and thick snow storm from  
west, under easy sail on different tacks,  
at 4 P.M. gam'd with the Comptroler,  
Middle and Latter part the same,  
on different tacks, thus ends,

Friday June 15<sup>th</sup>

Moderate with snow from N.W. all sail  
set head West, 6 sail and the ice in  
sight, at 6 P.M. gam'd with the Br. Commodore,  
Middle and Latter part light wind and thick  
fog from N.W. to N. stand N.W. this is the  
way the season goes, now storms, thick fog  
and no whales, encouraging,

Friday June 15<sup>th</sup>

Light air and thick fog from S.W. all sail  
set standing N.E. at 6 P.M. at a little saw  
a sail,  
Middle part thick same of the time wind from  
Eastward.

Latter part moderate and cloudy all sail set  
head N.W. the ice in sight, thus ends,

Saturday June 16<sup>th</sup>

Light wind and cloudy from north, all sail  
set standing different courses, 4 sail in sight  
and the ice, but not one lonely whale,  
Middle and Latter part variable, sometimes  
thick, and then clear, at 4 P.M. tacked  
to N.E. thus ends another day, and so they  
drag along, and I do not care how quick,  
the the season drags to a close, for I am  
lonesome, I do not believe there was ever such  
a set of a m. outlandish set on board of  
any ship, as the Lipser ship, Speedwell  
Capt. B. F. G. I believe, contains, I never was  
so disappointed in all my going, for I have  
always had some help,

Sunday June 17<sup>th</sup> 1860

Moderate breeze and clear from N.W. all sail  
set standing by the wind N.E. at 2 P.M. up  
to the ice tacked to West at 6 tacked to N.E.,  
one sail in sight,

Middle and Latter part light wind and pleasant  
at 7 P.M. gam'd with the Irish Swift, standing  
Westerly, thus ends,

Monday June 18<sup>th</sup>

Moderate breeze and pleasant from Eastward all sail  
set standing N.E. gamming with the Irish Swift,  
Middle part the same stand N.E. at 6 P.M.,  
handy to the land,

Latter part the same, stand different courses  
saw no whales, Cape Bhering E. by S. about  
20 miles at noon, thus ends,

Tuesday June 19<sup>th</sup>

Fresher breeze and cloudy from S.E. all sail  
set, at 2 P.M. tacked to S.S.W. and hauled  
light sails, the Irish Swift, in sight at 6  
P.M.

Middle part thick fog, at 11 saw ice more ship  
to E. by S. at 3 P.M. more again to S.S.W.  
Latter part more moderate set all sail fog not  
very thick, at 8 tacked to E. by S. thus ends,

Wednesday June 20<sup>th</sup>

Light wind and thick fog, all sail set, at 7 P.M.  
light wind from S.W. course East,

Middle and Latter part, light wind and  
pleasant all sail set standing along the land,

Thursday June 21<sup>st</sup>

Clear weather at 6 P.M. came to anchor  
off Glover Bay the ships at anchor here,  
Middle and Latter part light air and calm,  
employed gamming,

thus ends,
