

Friday June 29th 1860

Light wind from Southward all sail set heading
in towards Flower Bay, at 3 P.M., calms
anchored,

Middle part the same, at 4 A.M., light air
from Eastward, hove up the anchor and set all
sail, at 9 anchored again in Flower Bay,

Latter part fresh breeze from S.W., thus ends,

Saturday June 30th

Fresh breeze from S.W. got a small craft ready
for water,

Middle and latter part strong breeze and
thick fog some of the time, got off at small
raft of water, thus ends had times in Old Virginia

Sunday July 1st

Strong breeze and fog from S.W.

Middle and latter part much the same,
it has been a low some cold day, with me,
no one to converse with and the weather so
unpleasant to go round, thus ends,

Monday July 2nd

Fresh breeze and rugged thick weather, with considerable
swell, parted out chain to 60 fathoms,

Middle and latter part more moderate, but
cloudy, thus ends another day,

Tuesday July 3rd

Light wind and cloudy, old swell heaving in,
middle part wind died and thick fog,

Latter part wind the same and clear at 4 A.M.,
got under way set all sail and stood Westward
along the land, thus ends, I would give a
small sum if I had a couple of good men
to help me about the ship, I never was so
poorly off for help since I have been going,

Wednesday July 4th 1860

Light wind from E.S.E., quick clouds all sail
set, standing W.N.W. at 4 P.M., pushing with
rain, gave it with the Sturgeon, at 5 hauled

light sails, at 7 doubled reefed the 3 Sails,
Middle part more moderate with rain, set all sail,

Latter part light wind and calm with rain,
thus ends the 4th of July, and it has been wet

outside with us, but not in, feel the better for it,
what have I been doing all the day, I tramped

the decks all the forenoon, thinking over bygones,
and about your Mary Ann, ... there was

pleasant thoughts, have you forgotten the 29th
August 1857, time 3 P.M., weather rainy, want

I a fool, but may we live to meet again, it will
be a happy moment to me, but when I get to thinking

about the present, I am down, I want to get right
home, out of this delightful crowd, and then

they would get along first rate, as for getting much
of any ail, I do not expect it, and sometimes I

think, we are not deserving of any, if I do not
give a lecture when the time and place comes

right, it will be because I shall forget those times
I wish I could forget them, and think of better

things

Thursday July 5th

Calm with rain, at 3 P.M., lit up saw two
sail — middle part wind from W.E. head

Eastward, at 4 A.M., spoke the Electra
of New London direct from Kodiak,

nothing blowing off with rain, took in sail
to double reefed 3 Sails,

Latter part strong with rain at 11 wore
ship, to W.N.W., thus ends,
