

Friday July 6th 1860

Fresh gale with rain, from N.E., under
two double reefed Sails, head of W.M. at
10 P.M. at 11 little saw the land to the W. side,
at 12 more ship to E.S.E.
Middle part much the same,
Latter part more moderate at 6 A.M. more
ship to W. at 10 made sail, at 11 tacked
off shore, the land in sight, and two sail,

Saturday July 7th

Fresh breeze from E. at 6 all sail set, head
of S.E. at 2 P.M. tacked to W. side, at 4
off the mouth of Flower Bay, tacked to
S.E. at 8 hauled light sail, and double
reefed the S Sails, at 9 P.M. back of nature
of the Sandwich Islands died of Consumption
he took a sudden cold in getting water a few
days ago, and now he is no more,
Middle and Latter part strong breeze and
thick rainy weather from N.E. under double reefed
S Sails, an different parts, at 8 A.M.
Took the George Washington Warshaw, at
10 A.M. have aboard, and buried back the
nature, with not so much as reading a paper
or calling all hands to witness the burial,
it may be just as well, but one thinks I know
it does not look so well, and I never heard of
heaving a man overboard without calling all
hands to see it, and reading a chapter in
the Bible, it would be better in my estimation,
I do not care how quick the season passes off,

Sunday July 8th 1860

Strong breeze and thick from N.E. head E.S.E.
at 3 P.M. at 4 little more ship in shore
at 6 made sail, at 7 in the mouth of
Flower Bay, 3 sail in sight,
Middle and Latter part fresh breeze, beating
to windward through the night, at 9 P.M.
off Marcus Bay, double reefed the S Sails,
and head off, 3 sail in sight,

Monday July 9th

thick and
Fresh breeze and cloudy from N.E. under easy sail
off Marcus Bay, at 3 P.M. the Hellen Mar
anchored, gam'd it with her, at 5 went in
and anchored, to finish the game, at 6 the
Sharon came in, I am sick of such work,
Middle and Latter part more moderate and
thick, thus ends,

Tuesday July 10th

Moderate and thick from N.E. Capt and
Sally on board the Sharon,
Middle and Latter part calm and foggy, had
whaling this, thus ends,

Wednesday July 11th

Calm and foggy, Middle and Latter part
thick and rainy from N.E. this is hard work,

Thursday July 12th

Thick rainy weather from N.E.
Middle and Latter part thick dense fog this
makes 4 days we have been here, gamming every day
and if there ever was one poor miserable, lonesome,
discontented fellow that one is me, I would give half
I have made the voyage if I was out of it, I will
not sail any further than the first port with the
set that belongs aboard this ship's mainmast
either some of them or your humble servant must
leave and I am not particular which,
