

Saturday Sept 15th 1860

Light wind from NW, all sail set standing S by W, these sail in sight Cape East about 30 miles at sun down, the Pioneer W by N, the East head St. Lawrence Bay West, Middle and Latta parts moderate breeze from WNW, the land in sight the West side of the Shoals, and the most of it covered with snow, & sail in sight, thus ends,

Sunday Sept 16th

Light air from Westward all sail set head South by E, & sail in sight and the land to the Westward, Middle and Latta parts moderate from S by E to SE, at 4 A.M. wore ship, to SW, St. Lawrence Island in sight to the Eastward,

Monday Sept 17th

Fresh breeze and cloudy from SE, all sail set head S by W, at 2 P.M. thick fog at 3 let up, the West Head St. Lawrence Island E by E, about 5 miles, at 5 fog again, Middle part moderate with some rain, Latta part light wind from South, all sail set on different tacks, but at new M. S. G. sail, thus ends,

Tuesday Sept 18th

Light wind and cloudy from South, all sail set head E by E, the South head of St. Lawrence Island E by E, 20 miles, at 2 P.M. wore ship, to WNW, one sail in sight, Middle and Latta parts mild from E by E, all sail set head South, unhooked the S chain, and lashed the anchor, thus ends another day, the days come and go and I have by now found, but one thing I do know they do not pass very agreeable with me,

Wednesday Sept 19th 1860

Fresh breeze with fog squalls from East and at heavy swell from S, all sail set head S by E, Middle and Latta parts moderate from E by E, at 7 A.M. saw Goose Island bearing S by E, at 9 saw two right whales cow and calf, lowered the boats, dived at the cow, and the calf forced the boat, came on board, put out another boat, at noon lowered for more whale, the Florida in sight, I do not like it, wrought whole now,

Thursday Sept 20th

Fresh breeze from W by E, at 2 P.M. boat came on board, stand off S by E, G. S.

Middle part fog, Latta part fresh breeze from W by E, at 4 P.M. fog let up, at noon hoisted light sails, saw five boats, my thoughts have wandered homeward all the day, and a good share of them has been about you Mary, it you seem to take up much of my thoughts at times, why should it be so, what is love is there any such thing,

Friday Sept 21st

Strong breeze and cloudy from NW, course SE, at 4 P.M. double reefed Sails, main sail in, at 5 in jib and mizen Sails, at 6 raised Middle and Latta parts fresh gale, at 9 hoisted S Sails and held by the wind Eastward, at 6 P.M. set S Sails, at 9 hup off S by S, at 9 saw St. Pauls bearing S by E, at noon wore ship to WNW, thus ends another day and the life to be with this dance set,
