

Cruision On Camilla Ground August 1866

August

Wednesday The 1st

The first part of the twenty four hours began with light gail from the N. and foggy weather during the day. Under short sail saw 4 sails, and 4 masted Steamer Yards, to be the great Eastern: midle and latter part moderate gail and thick fog. Sailed

Lat by obs 47° 10' N

Long by do 22° 46' W

Thursday The 2^d

Begain with light gail and foggy weather, heading to the S.W. under short sail saw blackfish midle and latter part foggy and moderate breeze. Sailed

Lat by obs 46° 21'

Friday The 3^d

Begain with light wind from S.W. heading to the westward: very thick fog all day midle and latter part the same. Sailed

Lat by obs 45° 22'

Long by do 23° 28'

Saturday The 4th

Begain with light wind from W.S.W. and foggy weather heading to the S.W. impleid in breaking out for weather: midle and latter part moderate wind and clear weather. Sailed

Lat by obs 45° 47'

Long by do 23° 30'

Notes And Remarks On Board Ship Gosnell 1866

August Sunday The 5th

Begain with light wind from the westward heading to the N.W. under all sail saw 3 sails, at 8 A.M. that in sail usual: midle and latter part Calm and fine weather. Sailed

Monday The 6th

Begain with light wind from W.S.W. heading to the northward under all sail saw 3 sails, midle and latter part rainy and strong weather saw 6 sails. Sailed

Lat by obs 46° 40' N

Long by do 24° 11' W

Tuesday The 7th

Begain with moderate gail and suff. weather midle and latter part the same saw good many sails, steering to Eastward. Sailed

Lat by obs 45° 52' N

Long by do 25° 12' W

Wednesday The 8th

Begain with strong wind from S.W. heading to the S.W. under moderate sail impleid in shipy late midle and latter part strong wind and suff. weather saw plenty shipy. Sailed

Lat by obs 44° 40' N

Long by do 25° 30' W
