

Cruison on Camilla Ground August/66

August The 17th 1866

Friday

The first part of this twenty four hours
commenced with light wind from Westward
we steering to the Southward under all sail
in p.m. in ship's duty made and latter
part strong wind and ruff weather to end

Lat by Goby 43: 45
Long by do 32: 28

Saturday The 18th

Begain with moderate gail from
westward we heading to the Southward under
that sail saw a Schooner sailing to the
S.E. in morn and latter part strong wind
and ruff weather to end

Lat by Goby 43: 25
Long by do 31: 50 W

Sunday The 19th

Begain with strong wind from N.W.
we heading to the westward under that
sail saw 3 sails one was a whaler
at 8 o'clock spruck the Combs. Mory
15 morn the out 1600 by spruck sail
latter part ruff weather to end

Monday The 20th

Begain with strong wind from
S.W. heading to the Southward under
and latter part strong wind and
squally weather to end

Long by do 31: 28

Notes and Remarks on Board Ship Fore and Aft

August 21st 1866

Tuesday 21st

The first part of this twenty four hours
commenced with strong wind from Westward
we heading to the Southward two whalers in
sight squally all day at 4 o'clock saw the
Island of Carvo. and at 9 o'clock saw Flores
Western island. saw a sail latter part
squally and ruff to end

Wednesday The 22nd

Begain with strong wind from N.W.
we heading to the westward under that
sail the Island of Carvo and Flores
saw a S from us 20 miles off
at 10 o'clock the island was 30 miles from
us bearing S. S.E. middle and latter
part strong wind to end

Cruison off Flores: Thursday The 23rd

Begain with light wind from N.E.
Carvo and Flores 25 miles to Eastward of us
this day we been in p.m. in beating out
and beating up to the point: middle and
latter part strong wind and ruff weather
to end

Lat by 39: 30 W
Long by 31: 00 W

Friday The 24th

Begain with strong wind and squally
weather off and on at Flores and latter
fine weather in p.m. in getting recruits
to end
