Monday The 3^d

Begain with light air and fine weather
beat about on shore for letters but found
none at Sandown. 4 Island was in sight
of us Graciosa Pico Saint George and Fayal
middle and latter part fine (end)

Left and long by Graciosa and St George

Tuesday The 4th

Begain with light wind and fine
saw a whaling Steamer Terceira and Graciosa
St George Fayal was in sight to day
beat out for water middle and latter
part squally and rainy weather (end)

Left and long by the island

Wednesday The 5th

Begain with strong wind from Westward
interfering with Amer. S. Johnson
and James arrived middle and latter part
strong wind and ruff weather (end)

Left and long by St George

Thursday The 6th

Begain with moderate gail from Westward
and ruff sea at 7 short in sail
middle and latter part squally and rainy weather
to end,

Left by the steam of Terceira
long to go,

September 1866

Friday The 7th

Begain with strong wind from Westward and
squally weather. Cruise off Terceira saw four
ships and boats. middle and latter part light
wind and fine weather to end

Long and left by St George

Saturday The 8th

Begain with light air and calm in place
in breaking out periscope and other stuff saw
6 sails: Pico Terceira St George and Graciosa
in sight middle and latter part moderate gail and
ruff weather. to end

Left and long by Terceira

Sunday The 9th

Begain with moderate gail from Westward
and ruff weather long in under short sail the
Island of Terceira in sight saw 6 sails middle
and latter part fine (end)

Left and long by Terceira

Monday The 10th

Begain with light air and fine at Sand
down the island West South West from us
middle and latter part light wind and fine
to end

Left of Terceira long to go

Tuesday The 11th

Begain with light air and fine saw
8 sails were being in place in setting up rigging
middle and latter part light air and fine
weather to end

Left and long by Terceira
