Wednesday The 12th

The first part of the twenty four hours begins with light air and fine weather today we begin in plain in breaking out for weather and other things made and latter part Calms and fine
Lat and Long by Terceira

Thursday The 13th

Regain with Calms and fine weather we begin in plain in Coopering breath at Sun down Terceira land N. S. 1/2 N. 25 miles off; middle and latter part light breezes and fine weather Sailed
Lat and Long by Terceira

Friday The 14th

Regain with light wind and fine weather saw 1 Saily these day we begin in plain in ship duty middle and latter part fine Sailed

Lat and Long by Galiciza

Saturday The 15th

Regain with light wind and fine weather saw a large Spalm whale at 1 P.M. haul for him at 4 de return on board with out success middle and latter part fine Sailed

Lat and Long by Terceira Galiciza St. George

Sunday The 16th

Regain with light air and Calms saw porpoise and 6 Saily latter part Calms and fine Sailed

Remarks on Board Ship Gasenold

September 1866

Monday The 17th

The first part of these twenty four hours begins with light air and Calms saw 8 Saily plenty porpoise and grampas Sailed Terceira St. George and Galiciza was in sight middle and latter part fine breeze and weather Sailed
Lat and Long by the island

Tuesday The 18th

Regain with nice breeze and fine weather Sailed the boat St. Dominile saw 8 Saily these day begin in plain in blacksmithing; middle and latter part fine saw 3 Ships trying out to end
Lat and Long of Terceira

Wednesday The 19th

Regain with light air and fine weather saw 6 Saily; begin in plain in ship duty middle and latter part fine saw end
Lat and Long of Galiciza

Thursday The 20th

Regain with light wind and fine weather saw 3 Saily and a steamer these day in plain in blacksmithing middle and latter part fine Sailed

Lat and Long by Terceira

Friday The 21st

Regain with light wind and fine in plain in breaking for provisions; middle and latter part fine Sailed
Lat and Long by Terceira
Antonio Piza still Sick.
