weather baird

Saturday The 20th

Begain with Calm, and hot weather
this day we been imployed in splicing
one of mizen top stoves with and latter
Calm, and hot weather baird

weather wind the most part of the time

Comences with Squally weather wind from
the southward and western with and latter part
Calm, and Squally weather baird

Thursday The 25th

Begain with Calm, and Squally weather
saw a sail to the S.W. of us with and
latter part Squally weather baird

Friday The 26th

Begain with light wind, Chanable
and Squally weather with and latter part
baffling wind, and Calm, baird
