November Monday The 5th

The first part of the twenty four hours began with strong trade from S. E. by S. we heading up S. W. by S. under moderate sail at 6 P.M. single reef fore and main top sails made and latter part squally and ruff weather to end

Long by do 22:30 W

Tuesday The 6th

Begain with strong trade from S. E. we steering S. W. by W under moderate sail saw about steering to the southward at 6 P.M. double reef top sails made and latter ruff and strong trade wind

Lat by obs 6:58 S

Wednesday The 7th

Begain with strong trade from S. E. by S we heading up S. W. by S. under moderate sail brack out fore head and water made and latter strong trade and ruff weather to end

Lat by obs 7:00 S
Long by do 25:10 W

Thursday The 8th

Begain with strong trade from S. E. by S we heading S. W. by S. in plain in repairing the mainmast sail made and latter part the same to end

Friday The 9th

The first part of these twenty four hours began with moderate trade from S. E. by S we heading up S. S. W. under all sail in plain in ship duty made and latter part light trade and fine weather to end

Saturday The 10th

Begain with light trade from the S. E. we heading S. S. W. under all sail in plain in blowing the gally around fore side after made and latter part moderate trade we been in plain today in blacksmithing to end

Lat by obs 14:47 S

Sunday The 11th

Begain with light trade and pleasant weather saw juncos we steering S. by W under all sail made and latter part squally weather saw juncos to end

Lat by obs 18:12 S
Long by do 26:01 W

Monday The 12th

Begain with moderate trade and strong squally at times made and latter part the same to end

Lat by obs 18:48 S
