November The 13th Tuesday

The first part of these twenty four hours began with light trades from S. E. we steering to the south and in place in black smothering branch out fore water set up mizen galant back stays mid and latter part the same scene

Wednesday The 14th

Begain with moderate trades from S. E. heading up S. by W under all sail in place in black smothering and a thin misty saw finebacks saw a brig going to the north latter part touch in the fore and mizen galant sails scene

Thursday The 15th

Begain with strong trades from S. E. heading up S. S. W under moderate sail saw a bark going to the north saw finebacks mid and latter part squally and ruff weather scene

Lat by obs 25:07 S

Long by do 27:10 W

Friday The 16th

Begain with strong trades or heavy winds from S. E. we heading S. by W under all sail at 4 P.M. touch in fore and mizen galant sails at 7 P.M. set them again latter part the same scene

November Saturday The 17th

The first part of these twenty four hours began with moderate trades and fine weather we heading up S. by W under all sail in place in rigging our cutting stage mid and latter part fresh wind and thick weather scene

Sunday The 18th

Begain with fresh wind from E. by S. and we steering S. by E. under all sail at 7 P.M. saw a brig steering to the S. S. E. mid and latter part strong wind and ruff weather and rainy strong squally scene

Lat by obs 31:50 S

Monday The 19th

Begain with moderate gail from Eastward we steering S. by E. under double reef fore and main top sail with squally and rainy weather fore a ship and bark steering S. S. E. mid and latter part strong wind touch in fore and mizen top sails and close reef the main at 6 P.M. made west all sail saw a bark going to the Eastward saw finebacks scene
